In a world built for speed, it is easy to become an anxious, hurried group of people. Yet, this is not how the Lord desired us to live and experience life. Christians have been called to so much more and demonstrate what it looks like to find peace.

This is why this Advent season, leading up to Christmas, we are going through a sermon series titled "Unhurried Christmas" together with other churches in the Alliance.

Christmas is meant to be a time to reflect on what Jesus brought with Him when He entered the world in a manger. The angels declared: "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace among those with whom he is pleased!" (Luke 2:14)

But often, when Christmas comes, instead of peace on earth, it becomes a time when we are running from place to place, just trying to fit everything into an already busy schedule. Instead of experiencing the meaning of Christmas, we experience burnout with a bow on top. We move so quickly the very peace Christ came to bring becomes something we talk about but rarely touch.

Yet Scripture continually reminds us that peace is not the absence of activity—it is the presence of Christ. True peace does not wait for our calendar to clear or our obligations to shrink. Peace comes when our hearts slow down enough to remember who is Lord over our days.

As Isaiah prophesied long before the angels sang over Bethlehem, the Messiah would be called the "Prince of Peace" (Isaiah 9:6), peace is not a seasonal idea; peace is a Person.

To illustrate this, imagine a small lake hidden deep in the mountains. All around it, the winds can howl, storms can rage, and trees can bend beneath the weight of winter. But below the surface of the water, all remains calm. The lake is still because its peace comes from its depth, not its surroundings.

Our lives are often like the weather around that lake—swirling responsibilities, loud expectations, and the constant pressure to be everywhere for everyone. But Christ invites us to live from the depths rather than the surface. He calls us to a stillness rooted not in our circumstances but in His unchanging presence.

Jesus Himself modeled this unhurried peace. He never rushed, never panicked, never lived enslaved to the demands around Him. Even when crowds pressed in, Scripture tells us He would slip away to quiet places to pray (Luke 5:16). He lived with purpose, but never with hurry. And He invites us to learn from Him: "Come to me, all who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest" (Matthew 11:28). Rest is not an escape from life but an invitation into the life Jesus gives.

This Advent, the call of Christ is simple: slow down enough to see Him. Make room in the crowded inns of our hearts for the Savior who brings peace that surpasses all understanding (Philippians 4:7). Set aside a moment each day to be still before Him, to breathe deeply of His grace, and to remember that the Prince of Peace has already come near. And when we do this—when we choose depth over noise, stillness over hurry, presence over pressure—we bear witness to a weary world.

We become people who shine the peace of Christ into places where anxiety has deeply rooted itself. We show that Christmas is not an event to survive, but a Savior to behold. May this season be one where our hearts slow down and our souls awaken to the unhurried peace only Jesus can give.

ARC Mission: Youth Mentorship Program

We are thrilled to announce the launch of an intergenerational ministry: a dedicated Youth Mentorship Program. This initiative moves beyond traditional programming to focus on the relational discipleship modeled by Jesus, strengthening both our youth and our entire church community. This program is specifically for our Jr. High and High School students, who will have the opportunity to select a mentor. Our Youth Mentorship Program will run for eight weeks between February and March of next year. Mentors and



mentees will be asked to meet 4 to 6 times during this period in a public location. All selected mentors will be asked to attend a quick training session, with more detailed information coming out in January. If parents prefer their student not participate, please contact the Christian Education Committee.

- 2. Strong Belonging: Consistent support provides a stable presence, meeting the need to feel known, valued, and anchored to the church community.
