THOUGHTS FROM OUR PASTOR



As we gather around this altar today, our hearts are focused on two profound celebrations. In the Scriptures for this Mass our Lord invites us to lay down our heavy burdens and embrace the rest only He provides. At the same time, we mark a monumental milestone: the 250th anniversary of the birth of our Nation. These two realities blend beautifully. As a nation we celebrate 250 years of liberty; as Catholics are reminded that the ultimate foundation of all true freedom is God Himself.

To celebrate our Nation's milestone, our US Bishops consecrated our Nation to the Sacred Heart of Jesus at a special Mass on June 12th. In his homily AB Lori of Baltimore noted that as our country marks its anniversary it is tempting to be "nostalgic for the past or be anxious about the future. Instead, he said the Church chooses "trust," placing our nation into the Sacred Heart, not because America is perfect, but because it is beloved by God. He reflected, "Consecration requires the humility to acknowledge both the extraordinary moments of holiness in our country's history and the moments of failure, division, and sin. He said "We cannot come to the heart of Christ while pretending we have no need of His mercy."

Our country's story is one of great ideals—life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness—but it is also a story that has been marred by division and injustice, both historically and in the past year. We often mistake freedom for unbridled autonomy. True freedom is more than simply the right to do whatever we want. Christian freedom is freedom for unity, freedom for love, and the ability to sacrifice our own desires for the common good and the dignity of our neighbor. Happy 250th Birthday, America! – Fr. Tom

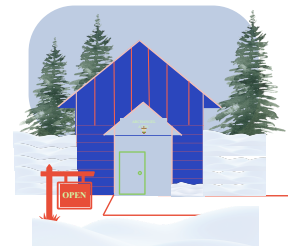

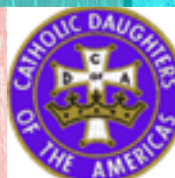
THE KNIGHT OF THE MONTH

Renovate the "Archangel Attic"

Why? Didn't we already do this project last year? Answer: We completed phase I. We raised approximately \$36,000 and that amount will allow us to install new windows, a new secure entry door and paint the exterior of the building this summer. Proceeds from this year's appeal will allow us to complete this two-year renovation project. In the summer of 2027 we will install a new furnace, renovate the bathroom, and replace all lighting with LED fixtures. Once completed, the Archangel Attic will be ready for the next decade! The Attic serves as an outreach to the needy in our community, as well as a revenue source for scholarships to Lumen Christi Catholic High School (generating more than \$1.4 million since 2011!). All staff, including managers Mary and Colleen, are volunteers. **Thank you!**

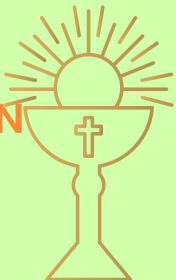

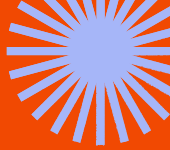

Summer is here and though we are enjoying this season of sunny skies, warm weather, and magnificent mountains, often our lives are still filled with turmoil and unsettled issues. This is the time to hang on to hope and view it as a virtue and a discipline we can embrace. This article explores ideas and thoughts of hope.

Grammy Award-winning artist and musician Jon Batiste shares his view “I like to look at things as happening on different axes.” . . . “things happening at once from the perspective of your own life, the perspective of observing the world around you, and ultimately, observing history.”

He visualizes hope as finding something that is true and meaningful for you. You begin to find authentic joy. . . from pain. It's a transmutation and an alchemizing of pain. Deep hope can't be suppressed by bad circumstances. Hope transcends the conditions of your circumstances.

Organizer and activist Mariame Kaba reflected on hope as a discipline. “For me, hope doesn't preclude feeling sadness or frustration or anger or any other emotion that makes total sense.

Hope isn't an emotion. . . Hope is not optimism. The idea of hope being a discipline is something I heard from a nun many years ago who was talking about it in conjunction with making sure we were of the world and in the world...It was important for us to live in the world and be of the world. The hope she was talking about was this grounded hope we practice every day....”

Brian McLaren suggests hope is a quality of aliveness; the feeling resulting from a happy outcome. If we can see a likely path to our desired outcome, we have hope; if we can see no possible path to our desired outcome, we have despair. When our prime motive is love, a different logic comes into play. We find courage and confidence, not expecting a happy ending, rather knowing it is our commitment to love.

Sometimes when we find ourselves hoping, we hear others say we are viewing things through rose-colored glasses. But true hope allows us to feel the holiness of our regular life. It is the Holy Spirit's power of love enveloping us.

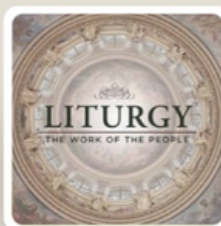
