

May we be guided by the light of the Gospel

The three kings have arrived! The Magi were from the East, from modern day Saudi Arabia and Ethiopia. They brought valuable gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. But, more importantly, they were truly enlightened in their minds and hearts. They knew who the Infant really was. They had each heard God speaking, and responded wholeheartedly. Tragically, King Herod lived in the darkness of his mind and heart. His lust for pleasure darkened his mind. His thirst for power, control, and glory hardened his heart. St. Paul relates that God sent His Son into the world for Gentiles, as well as for the Jews. Unfortunately, the early Christian converts from Judaism believed that Jesus came only for them. St. Paul, himself, believed in this way until the Holy Spirit enlightened him. Furthermore, it was a truly wonderful revelation. No one is excluded from the salvation that Jesus brought to the world! 
KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS THANKSGIVING GLOVE DRIVE



The 13th Day of Christmas

Which verse is your favorite of "The Twelve Days of Christmas" song? Just like Christmas, this song appeals to all ages—the excitement, anticipation, hilarity, the goodwill—and makes it fun to sing. Where do we focus? It is just too much! In the Catholic faith, the twelve days of Christmas begin on December 26 and end on Epiphany.

During the weeks of merriment and hustle and bustle, the true meaning of Christmas is often lost. We try to remember God's Son was born in a manger and wrapped in swaddling clothes; then at a gift exchange, this message becomes tangled in the ripped wrapping paper. We begin to think about angels glorifying His birth until the heavenly smell our favorite cookies overtake our thoughts. We concentrate on the words to "Away in a Manger" until we sing, "Lay down His sweet head," and then "visions of sugar plums danced in their heads" takes over. The traps are everywhere as we try so hard to think of Jesus. That is where the 13th Day of Christmas comes in.

As Catholics, how do we spend our time from Christmas Day to Epiphany? Do we live the authentic 12 days of Christmas enjoying feasts AFTER Christmas; leaving our decorations up until January 6 commemorating the revealing of Jesus, the Christ to the Gentiles as represented by the Magi (Matt 2:1-2)? Or are we caught up in the commercialization of this holiday; returning gifts not fitting us whether clothing or items and undecorate Christmas, putting it back in the box, or the basement, or even the curb on December 26? What day, this holiday season, becomes THE day we become different?

Do we wake up a different person as God hopes for us? Do we worship the infant for a day, but not the man and His teachings all year long? Do we put Him away with the decorations? Do we capture the flitting moments of the season when we do concentrate of His great love for us and transform our lives? Do we try to be more like Him?

God sent His Son to be born in a manger, to live, to teach, to die, and to be resurrected, for us. May God's immense love for us transform our hurts, our losses, and our woundedness into OUR love for those who have hurt, mocked, and belittled us. Love does not come to us as easily as revenge, meanness, and vengeance. With God as our Captain, we can conquer. Let us live each day with God at its center. 
