THOUGHTS FROM OUR PASTOR



“Behold, the Lamb of God”

Jesus was the son of Mary and Joseph of Nazareth. He was a carpenter. He appeared to be no one special. Even his cousin, John the Baptist, had no sense of the deeper reality of Jesus until He came to be baptized and then John discovered who Jesus really was. John proclaimed that Jesus was the Lamb of God. 1,500 years before this, the original Paschal Lambs were sacrificed. Their blood helped deliver the Chosen People from their bondage in Egypt; however, the new Lamb of God would do much more. He would deliver the world from the bondage of sin and eternal death. He would deliver people from the sin of the world. And the sin of the world was all the combined misdeeds and godlessness of the human race since its beginning. It is fortunate that John the Baptist was always open to God (Yahweh). God had guided John on every step of his journey. He knew that he was preparing for someone special. He did this by calling everyone to a baptism of repentance at the Jordan river. John knew that the one coming was far greater than himself, and that He existed before him. Consequently, we should be eternally grateful: for our Baptism, which takes away the Original Sin of our first parents and for the Eucharist, wherein we receive the Lamb of God. — *Fr. Tom*





Father Leo Walsh's Three-Step Plan for Making Resolutions

Father Leo Walsh has a column in the North Star each month where he answers parishioners' questions on a variety of topics. In the January 2026 issue, he answered a question about New Year's resolutions. The following is from his column.

"I organize my resolutions into three areas: Mind, Body, and Spirit. How will you expand your mind this coming year? Perhaps by reading the biography of a famous person or a favorite saint? Or how about an historical document like the U.S. Constitution or the major documents of Vatican II? Is there something YOU wish to learn about? Look up the original sources and go for it.

What about that body God gave you? What physical goals will you set this year? Will you hike Flattop at least three times? Take a walk each evening? Get on that workout routine you have neglected? How will you motivate yourself or have another motivate you? I have a former parishioner who texts me just about every day as my "Chief Motivational Officer." Use it to your advantage.

Finally, what will you do to feed your spirit this year? How will your prayer routine be enriched? Is there a parish pilgrimage to Rome or the Holy Land coming up; a trip to the National Shrine of St Therese in Juneau you might take; a retreat you have been meaning to make?

Whatever your resolutions or goals for the coming year, be deliberate and be specific. They should be reasonable and achievable in the short term (one month), in the mid-term (three months) and in the long term (6-12 months). Have fun." (Adapted: Ask Father Leo North Star January 2026)


