⇒ Principal's Update:

Many thanks to those of you who joined us virtually for the 10th Annual State of the School on Tuesday night, after a full day of dropping off and picking up your child at Our Lady of Guadalupe! The weather was a bit frightening that day, but the celebration of the Mass was absolutely beautiful! And we had over

70 participants on the Google Meet call on Tuesday night!

The State of the School slide deck and the 2026-2027 school calendar are attached to this week's Lumen News. For those that were not able to attend on Tuesday, the presentation is full of important information about what we've done as a school and where we are going. In addition to announcing the departure of Mrs. Guzman from the front desk in late April, Ms. Brewer and I both made announcements about our upcoming transitions. I appreciate Ms. Brewer sharing her news about retiring from full-time teaching at the end of this school year after 30 years of service to our school and to our students. She was one of the original "plankowners" when the school started in 1996 off Fireweed Drive! I'm working hard to encourage Ms. Brewer to spend some time at the school in various part-time capacities going forward! She has made a dramatic difference in the lives of so many and we are so grateful for all the years she has given to us!

Following Ms. Brewer's news, my wife Tracy and I, announced our decision to step away from my role as Principal, not this year, but at the end of next school year, in May 2027. This last decade as your Principal has been one of the greatest privileges and honors of our life—an amazing journey defined by faith, family and excellence. And, most importantly, by all of our time spent with you.

Tracy and I have truly loved our time here at Lumen Christi. Please know that we haven't made this decision lightly, but rather after much prayer and reflection. After a 21 year career in the Marine Corps, and eventually, 11 years as your Principal, Tracy and I want to follow a few more dreams, including hiking the Camino de Santiago, living closer than a 12 hour flight to our three kids, and maybe, God willing, spending time with some grandchildren. We aren't leaving Alaska for good, but intend to spend several weeks to several months here when it is much warmer, and far less snowier, than it is right now!

I know that this news may come as a surprise to many, and expected as an eventuality by others. My 30 years of being a leader has impressed upon me that healthy and successful transitions happen from a place of stability and strength. Through Tuesday's presentation, I hope you see that these decisions come at a time when the State of our School is very, very strong. In the end, I'm proud to report that Lumen Christi is in its most solid position since its founding in 1996—with a firm financial foundation, a clear mission and purpose, record enrollment, and a deeply committed and professional staff ready to continue carrying and leading our great school forward. Before I leave, in my final 18 months as your Principal, among other things, I personally commit to overseeing the transition of our much admired Ms. Brewer at the end of this school year, supervising the expansion of our campus with our portables this summer, and successfully leading the school through our Cognia accreditation in spring 2027.

There will be plenty of time for goodbyes, emotional speeches, and hugs down the road. But Tracy and I, and Ms. Brewer as well, wanted to share this information with you now so we are fully transparent on the succession plan we have put together over the next 18 months for our transitions from the school.

Thank you for all your support and flexibility this week. It wasn't exactly the Celebrate Catholic Schools Week we planned, but God blessed us with a chance to celebrate our students on Monday, a beautiful all schools Mass on Tuesday, and a restful ice day on Thursday. Please pray for our high school basketball teams as they compete in the 2A Conference Clash this weekend! Go Archangels!

Bread and Wine

“Bread and wine are ambiguous, both in life and in the Eucharist. On one hand, bread is perhaps our primary symbol for food, health, nourishment, and community. Few things speak as wonderfully about life as does the smell of fresh bread, yet there is another story to bread. Bread is made of kernels of wheat that had to be crushed in their individuality to become something communal, flour, which then had to endure fire to be baked into the substance that gives off the smell of life.

Wine too speaks in this double way: On the one hand, it is a festive drink, perhaps our foremost symbol for celebration. Wine has nothing to do with basic nourishment or necessity. Wine speaks of friendship, community, celebration, joy, recreation, victory. We celebrate everything with wine. Like bread, wine has another side: Individual grapes are crushed and their very blood becomes the substance out of which ferments this warm, festive drink. No wonder Jesus chose it to represent his blood.

It is helpful to keep this ambiguity in mind whenever we participate in the Eucharist. Bread and wine are held up to be blessed by God and to become the flesh and blood of Christ, and they are held up precisely in their ambiguity.

On the one hand they represent everything in life and in the world that is healthy, young, beautiful, bursting with energy, and full of color. They represent the goodness of this earth, the joy of human achievements, celebration, festivity, and all that is contained in that original blessing when, God looked at the earth and pronounced it good. The Eucharist too gives off the smell of fresh bread. The Eucharist also holds up, in sacrifice, all that is being crushed, broken, and baked by violence. The wine, fittingly, is also blood. At the Eucharist, we hold up both, the world's health and its achievements along with its depressions and failures and ask God to be with us in both. In John's Gospel, water becomes wine and wine becomes blood and blood and water both eventually flow out of the pierced side of Jesus. That happens too in the Eucharist, and it happens in our lives. The task is to hold them both in our hands, as happens at Eucharist, and then offer them up to God.”

What is Hallow?




