⇒ Principal's Update:

What a busy week it has been! We started off the week with a stomach bug illness (most likely norovirus) working its way through about 10-15% of our student body. Our absent numbers spiked on Tuesday, but each day since has brought students back to school. We have been working closely with the Mu-

nicipal public health department to determine the cause (if we can) and, more importantly, review our health and hygiene protocols. It appears that norovirus numbers are spiking all over the city, so this isn't limited to just our school community. This was coupled with another illness—a persistent head and chest congestion—in other students. Thank you to everyone who kept/is keeping their students at home if they feel ill. Please continue to pray for good health in our community.

The Virtue of the Week is APPRECIATION. The Vice is ENTITLE-MENT. I used this week as an opportunity to take a speaking tour around Houses during 7th period to encourage all students to Be Appreciative, not Entitled. I think this is a particularly important message as we go into the THANKSGIVING holiday. In my 6–8-minute talk, I emphasized two main points: 1) appreciation and respect for our teachers and 2) appreciation and respect for our school-our common home. I wasn't accusing anyone, or any group in particular but rather reiterate our high expectations of behavior here at Lumen Christi. We've had an uptick in student disrespect-arguing, talking back, and speaking condescendingly-towards teachers. In addition, some students are not abiding by classroom rules and expectations of behavior-most notably in the abuse of computer privileges (playing games during class, for example) or leaving trash/ garbage all over the classroom. I asked all students to show appreciation for our hardworking and dedicated teachers going forward and avoid having a sense of entitlement. We've also had an uptick in a general lack of respect for our common home and school property. Students often rock back in chairs, put feet up on tables and desks, draw/write on school property, and leave trash all over locker rooms, rest rooms, classrooms, the hallway, etc. I reiterated that not all students are doing these things but asked everyone-staff and students-to rise to the challenge to pick up after ourselves and respect our school property to show our appreciation as good stewards of our "home away from home." To do otherwise shows a sense of entitlement (e.g. a mentality that "someone else will just clean or pick it up"). I related to our students that my dream is that one day, our school janitor, Romy, and his wife Nora, would tell me "we didn't need to clean the school this evening because your students cleaned it themselves during the day! We headed home early!" I realize that this may not happen, but it is certainly a worthy goal ALL OF US can work towards! Lumen is a very special place and all of us make it so. Thanks for your help while on break in reinforcing this important mes-

We wish our girls' volleyball team good luck in the Borealis Conference Tournament held at Lumen Christi this weekend. I encourage you to come out, support, and cheer our ladies on to victory!

Second week of Advent

This Second week of Advent's theme is John the Baptist, whom we focus on every Advent. Picture John: a strange man, dressed in loincloth—a hippie—doing his own thing down by the river, willing to let go of everything, stating his is water baptism but what really matters is the baptism of "Spirit and Fire." John's single part in life is to proclaim Jesus' greatness, which he does in no uncertain words.

Jesus trusts him and accepts his non-temple, offbeat nature ritual saying of him: "There is no man greater than John the Baptist, yet the least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he." (Matt 11:11)

John emptied himself of his ego so he could proclaim the greatness of Jesus. This wasn't John's one-time humble sharing of his Lord. His life was always about the coming of Jesus and the greatness He would proclaim. John knew through constant letting go, acts of devotions, and perpetual emptying of his ego, he could display his spirituality of descent, allowing Jesus to be shown to others as the true Son of God.

However, here are significant difference between John the Baptist and Jesus:

- * John had people come out to him in the wilderness. Jesus went to people in their towns, villages, and homes.
- * John's message was a fiery one, threatening dire consequences for those who didn't take it to heart. Jesus' message was a more joyful announcement of good news.
- * Unlike John, Jesus went out of his way to reach out to sinners, even to eat and drink with them. Jesus took the initiative to reach out to those in need, including the marginalized.
- * No miracles are reported of John, but the ministry of Jesus was filled with miracles, especially healings.

But the biggest difference is this: Although both John and Jesus preached repentance, a change of heart, and reform, Jesus was more than a reformer. He was a transformer. He changed the condition of the world by his entry into history.

John the Baptist recognized this difference: "I am baptizing you with water, for repentance, but the one who is coming after me is mightier than I . . . He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire."

If you want to transform your life, turn to Jesus. (Adapted from The Little Blue Book page 33)


