





Third Sunday of Advent

Christmas is coming! Christmas is coming! This is a familiar chant of all children as they daily open a door on their Advent calendars. It is a special time for all people "young at heart." Children try to be extra nice to all those around them. Teens try to be less dramatic and adults hold fast to the true meaning of Christmas, knowing our Lord and Savior is born to redeem the world.

The Third Sunday of Advent is often called Gaudete Sunday. "Gaudete" means "Rejoice" in Latin, celebrating the nearness of Christ's birth and the joy of the coming Messiah. This candle signifies this joy as the Lord's coming is near, and is marked by lighting the rose/pink candle on the Advent wreath instead of purple.

The season of Advent in the Christian calendar anticipates the "coming of Christ" from three different perspectives: the physical nativity in Bethlehem, the reception of Christ in the heart of the believer, and the eschatological Second Coming.

In its early years, Advent was associated as a time of penitence with a period of fasting. It was recommended fasting from three days to all days of Advent. Now the Church recommends parishioners make a conscious effort to spend daily quiet time with the Lord. The liturgy of Advent remained unchanged until the Second Vatican Council introduced minor changes, differentiating the spirit of Lent from that of Advent, emphasizing Advent as a season of hope for Christ's coming now as a promise of his Second Coming. Challenge:

Spend some quiet time with the Lord.

Quote:

"The liturgy of Advent...helps us to understand fully the value and meaning of the mystery of Christmas. It is not just about commemorating the historical event which occurred some 2,000 years ago in a little village of Judea. Instead, it is necessary to understand that the whole of our life must be an 'advent,' a vigilant awaiting of the final coming of Christ. To predispose our mind to welcome the Lord who, as we say in the Creed, one day will come to judge the living and the dead, we must learn to recognize him as present in the events of daily life. Therefore, Advent is, so to speak, an intense training that directs us decisively toward him who already came, who will come, and who comes continuously." ~St. John Paul II


