THOUGHTS FROM OUR PASTOR



"Emmanuel - God is with us" - Always!

"Emmanuel" - "God is with us". But, if we are honest, most of us have known times when God seems distant, unapproachable, not interested in the events of our lives. Perhaps we have mused, "Where was God when I lost my job, or my home, or my marriage, or my spouse to illness?" St. Joseph also wondered how he could end up marrying a woman, his betrothed, who was with child but not by him. Had God abandoned him? These are legitimate questions, and the standard answer, that God was with us as we suffered, rarely convinces. We need a God not afar off but close at hand. For many, God is not close at hand. ⇒ Principal's Update:

We find ourselves at the end of the fall semester and entering a much needed and anticipated Christmas break! We pray for our high school basketball teams as they compete in this weekend's Lumen Christi Invitational Tournament against 10 girls teams and 7 boys teams from

across the State of Alaska. If you are around town, come to our gym to support and cheer on our teams in their first games of the season! We can also use your help for concession sales and manning the admission gate table—check your Remind messages for details! For those traveling during break, our prayers are with you for safe travel and joy.

This next announcement will be popular with some and unpopular with others. Starting January 5th, energy drinks are banned in our school building 30 minutes before the start of school, during the day, and 30 minutes after the final bell. Energy drinks come in many forms, but the most popular are Monster, Red Bull, C4, Celsius, Yerba Mate, and Alani Nu. While we know that students often drink these for increased energy, the dangers to adolescents including dehydration, increased heart rate, anxiety, and insomnia are real: (https://www.cdc.gov/school-nutrition/media/images/2024/09/The Buzz on Energy Drinks infographic.png) and (https://www.nccih.nih.gov/health/energy-drinks).

A short survey of our students (96 total responses) revealed that a third of our students consume at least 1-2 energy drinks a day, including weekends, with some consuming 3 or more each day. My own observations greeting students each morning tells me the number of students starting their day with a Red Bull, Monster, or Alani Nu is probably much higher than the survey results reveal. Unfortunately, our teachers often experience the "crash"--sleeping in class, irritability, mood swings, lack of focus, and other misbehaviors—later in the day when the quick energy boost wears off. Excessive caffeine and sugar intake can also disrupt sleep patterns—which can lead to reduced academic performance. Caffeine dependency leads students to feel like they need another energy drink to function and the cycle starts anew. Are you seeing similar results at home?

So yes, we have educated and are educating our students on the dangers of these drinks, but just like cell phones back in 2018, we feel that these drinks are counterproductive to our learning environment. And because they are highly caffeinated and highly sugary, they are ultimately harmful to our young people. Therefore, the staff and I feel that simply removing them from our school environment is the most effective and appropriate approach. The school has two filtered water bottle fill stations to support better choices. Thank you for sharing this information with your son or daughter over break and supporting us starting in January.

On behalf of our school staff, I want to thank you for all of your support and assistance over this fall semester. We wish you a very merry Christmas and a happy New Year!





Merry Christmas or Season's Greetings

The decision to celebrate the birth of Jesus on December 5th is not based on careful calculations of the actual day Jesus was born. Its origins were from polytheistic Rome, December 25th was a celebration of the Unconquered Sun, marking the return of longer days. It followed Saturnalia, a festival where people feasted and exchanged gifts.

In today's world, we see the reverse. The celebrations of Christmas are being shorn of all religious symbols and connotations: Santa has replaced the Christ Child; Rocking around the Christmas tree has replaced Come all Ye Faithful and I'm Dreaming of a White Christmas has replaced Silent Night. Merry Christmas has become Season's Greetings.

Fewer people are drawn religiously to the Christmas story, even as they value the Christmas season as a very special time of year. They value the feast for its emphasis on love, giftgiving, color, specialness, and celebration, but prefer the emphasis be precisely on these things without a reference to Christ. Many also think we are a secularized culture, not a Christian culture, and it is unfair to non-Christians to emphasize the religious (Christ) aspect of this feast. It is offensive to Jews, Moslems. Buddhists, agnostics, and non-believers. Given the pluralistic make-up of our society, saying "Merry Christmas" can be imperialistic, narrow, and not fully respectful of others. This carries some legitimacy, though it is also deeply flawed. This criticism doesn't come mainly from Jews, Muslims, and the non-Christians. It arises mostly from some excessive and less-than-fully healthy sensitivities within Christians and ex-Christians. We need to be sensitive to others and realize and accept we cannot impose a Christian celebration on those who don't share our faith. But society must also be fair to us and allow us to celebrate Christ's birthday as a religious feast.

No one should begrudge another for saying Merry Christmas or Season's Greetings. Silent Night can play alongside White Christmas. Jesus, no doubt, is on good terms with Santa. Love, joy, gift-giving, and colorful lights do their own work on the heart and what they do there is contingent upon what is in that heart. To some hearts they will say, Merry Christmas, to other hearts they will say, Season's Greetings, and to some hearts they will say both. We should be good with that. 
