



Why? Change of age and grade level for the reception of the sacrament of Confirmation

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

May the grace and peace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with you.

The grace and strength received from the sacraments of the Church are essential for every Catholic to lead a good Christian life, joyfully witnessing to the Gospel and defending the Catholic faith we hold dear.

The sacraments of Christian initiation - Baptism, Confirmation, and the Eucharist - lay the foundations of every Christian life. "The sharing in the divine nature given to men through the grace of Christ bears a certain likeness to the origin, development, and nourishing of natural life. The faithful are born anew by Baptism, strengthened by the sacrament of Confirmation, and receive in the Eucharist the food of eternal life. By means of these sacraments of Christian initiation, they thus receive in increasing measure the treasures of the divine life and advance toward the perfection of charity." (Catechism of the Catholic Church – CCC - No. 1212)

Today's youth encounter numerous secular and anti-Christian influences at an earlier age than ever before. After consulting with the priests of the archdiocese and receiving their unanimous support, I am adjusting the age and grade for the reception of the sacrament of Confirmation in the archdiocese to 11 years of age and 5th grade. At this age and grade level, our youth are receptive to catechesis and parental guidance, and more will receive the sacrament.

This change begins today. The goal is for every parish to implement fully the change by the 2028 Easter season. The Easter season is fifty days, starting on Easter and concluding on Pentecost.

The pastors will determine how to ensure that individuals aged 11 and older who have not yet received the sacrament of Confirmation may do so after receiving catechesis and formation.

On October 30, 2024, while greeting a group of newly confirmed, Pope Francis prayed that the Holy Spirit would "inflame your hearts and make you joyful witnesses for Christ."



With Bob McMorrow leaving the helm of St. Ben's Evangelization, perhaps it is time we each looked at our role in sharing our faith with those around us. God is always calling each of us to share His love with others.

Were you aware St. Benedict's Parish has an Evangelization Team led by Bob McMorrow? This team has been working steadfastly over the last seven years to teach our parishioners how to begin conversations with others who are ready to learn more about Jesus and salvation.

What do you think of when you hear the word, evangelization? The "door-to-door Christian salesmen" who ask if you are saved? Or those who have glossy invitations requesting you to join them during their services? These are perspectives of evangelizing, but certainly not the only ones.

Much of evangelization comes down to listening to others as they talk about their faith journey. Although there is no wrong or right way to evangelize, Catholics strive to share their faith through developing relationships, telling their faith stories, and listening. As in anything we become involved in, sometimes we are ready, other times it is an inconvenience. But often times a small seed is planted.

Relationships! Strengthening our own relationship with God through prayer, mass, and sharing our stories is a great way to start our own evangelization with others. Perhaps you have a friend who is willing to listen to your story. Or you have starting attending the Tuesday morning group, "Blessed Are Women," Esto Vir, or any of the other groups offered at St. Ben's and you realize you have questions.

It is okay to ask the Lord specific questions such as "Is there someone I would be a good fit to share my story? Or to ask to hear theirs?" "Am I ready or should I continue to ask more questions?" You will know when He would like you to share His salvation with others. It will be a burning flame in your heart.

As you share your faith story, remember to listen. Do not be afraid of different perspectives. (The Bible has 365 verses containing "Do not be afraid." God is aware of our emotions.) Different views can widen and deepen our own commitment to God.

We are not asked to judge or condemn; rather we are to become persons of welcome making every effort to avoid critical or judgmental thoughts, attitudes, and words. You do not need all the answers. Referring others to Father Tom or others you feel would be more equipped to help is a strength.

Encouraging an attitude of acceptance will broaden our community. Remember Jesus seemed more interested in how people lived than what they believed. Listening with the heart of Jesus will strengthen our relationships and draw those near to our God of love, mercy, and charity.


Men Needed!!


