





Change of age and grade level for the reception of the sacrament of Confirmation

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

May the grace and peace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with you.

The grace and strength received from the sacraments of the Church are essential for every Catholic to lead a good Christian life, joyfully witnessing to the Gospel and defending the Catholic faith we hold dear

The sacraments of Christian initiation - Baptism, Confirmation, and the Eucharist - lay the foundations of every Christian life. "The sharing in the divine nature given to men through the grace of Christ bears a certain likeness to the origin, development, and nourishing of natural life. The faithful are born anew by Baptism, strengthened by the sacrament of Confirmation, and receive in the Eucharist the food of eternal life. By means of these sacraments of Christian initiation, they thus receive in increasing measure the treasures of the divine life and advance toward the perfection of charity." (Catechism of the Catholic Church – CCC – No. 1212)

Today's youth encounter numerous secular and anti-Christian influences at an earlier age than ever before. After consulting with the priests of the archdiocese and receiving their unanimous support, I am adjusting the age and grade for the reception of the sacrament of Confirmation in the archdiocese to 11 years of age and 5th grade. At this age and grade level, our youth are receptive to catechesis and parental guidance, and more will receive the sacrament.

This change begins today. The goal is for every parish to implement fully the change by the 2028 Easter season. The Easter season is fifty days, starting on Easter and concluding on Pentecost.

The pastors will determine how to ensure that individuals aged 11 and older who have not yet received the sacrament of Confirmation may do so after receiving catechesis and formation.

On October 30, 2024, while greeting a group of newly confirmed, Pope Francis prayed that the Holy Spirit would "inflame your hearts and make you joyful witnesses for Christ."




JOY

Have you noticed how most of our thoughts center around our families? Our thoughts become our actions and the more we imitate our Lord the more we choose to praise Him. Though we may find ourselves occupied with less than optimum views of our lives, focusing on our Lord naturally turns us toward praise of His wonderful world.

However, it is truly a daily exercise to change "the tapes" in our head. We are tired, disappointed how our days are often filled with trivia, upset with the interruptions crowding out what we hope to accomplish. Focusing on God's glory becomes lost in the frenzied traffic, the road detours, and the outrageous coffee lines. All these disruptions and it isn't even 8:00 yet! Are we really supposed to be positively praising God?

A simple acronym to help us remember what is important—and worthy of our faithfulness—is JOY. J, first and foremost, stands for JESUS; O is OTHERS; and Y is YOURSELF. Praising and glorifying Jesus, giving thanks for others and yourself will align your thoughts in a positive way delighting God as He guides both you and others throughout each day. 
