





Mercy

The Catholic calendar has one Sunday a year marked as Mercy Sunday. However, mercy is a daily responsibility-- not one day a year obligation--for each us. Our God is a God of relationships. He desires a relationship with each of us. We, in turn, want to please God through our relationship with Him. In all relationships, mercy is an important ingredient. Seemingly, though, it is an impossible task for humans. How can we show mercy when we so desperately need it ourselves? Thankfully, we do possess the necessary components to show mercy. The following four ordinary ways will start us on our journey. Begin with those persons closest to you and stretch yourselves to others around you.

- 1. Be patient with one another. Don't immediately get angry and don't get upset. Instead, take a deep breath. When we control our anger, we make a decision to be understanding and merciful. "Be patient with each other, making allowances for each other's faults because of your love." (Ephesians 4:2)
- 2. Be kind to those who have offended you. Ephesians 4:32 says it succinctly, "Be kind to one another compassionate, forgiving one another as God has forgiven you."
- 3. Give others a second chance. Show mercy through not choosing to get even nor forgetting about that person. (Again, take a deep breath and ask God to open your heart to that person.) Give them a second chance; treat them cheerfully with a smile, and don't give up on anyone.
- 4. Help anyone hurting around you. Also, do good to those who hurt you. Mercy is giving people what they need, not what the deserve. Mercy is not what we do but what God has done for us. We need to know this mercy of God to be merciful.

Ephesians 4:25-32 gives us how we are to conduct ourselves daily, including what to remove from our daily emotions. Often, hearing the unsavory ways we have acted makes us cringe and wanting us to eliminate those reactions. Ephesians 4:31 says, "All bitterness, fury, anger, shouting, and reviling must be removed from you, along with all malice." Those words churn our stomachs as we are aware of the times we have acted disgustingly. Those are responses we do not want to possess nor have lashed out at us. May our patience with one another, our kindness toward those who offend us, our desire to give all a second chance, and our helpfulness toward those hurting become our daily outcomes as we strive to become merciful. 
