



The Benefits and Fulfillment of Hope

When we speak of the virtue of hope, it is a noun—an act of trust in God. Of course, it is also a verb as in "We hope for an answer to a diagnosis." We use it as an adjective: "The hopeful assistant expected to be promoted." It can also be an adverb: "Hopefully, our beautiful summer will continue into the fall." These three sentences, however, are considered optimism, idealism, or a positive attitude.

Perhaps another way to help explain hope is through its opposite—fear or despair. We all have experienced fear. It flits into our day when we slide through an icy intersection. It bombards us when we receive news of a death of a loved one or a medical report of a debilitating disease. During hardships, God wants us to maintain hope. "Rejoice in hope, be patient in suffering, persevere in prayer. (Rom 12:12). As we traverse the darkness and even death, we will not lose hope if we remember the words of Pope Francis. He reminded us true hope is not built of human words or assurances but it is God's Word and His promise of salvation and eternal life. This is the theological virtue of hope; possibly the most difficult to understand.

This trust in God is an unshakable assurance His promises will be fulfilled. We see what God has done for us in His Son Jesus, through His Death and Resurrection. Through the grace of Jesus, the Lord's suffering and death on the Holy Cross, the Christian has "hope that does not disappoint, God's love having been poured into his heart through the Holy Spirit Who has been given to them." (Rom 5:5)

Pope Francis also emphasized we should have an impact on others. He stated "in order to give hope to others, it is sometimes enough simply to be kind, to be 'willing to set everything else aside in order to show interest, to give the gift of a smile, to speak a word of encouragement, to listen amid general indifference". (NorthStarCatholic.org/March2021)

Can we be certain of hope? The assurance of the Christian is his faith and hope in the Words of Jesus. Jesus said: "Fear not little flock, for it is your Father's good pleasure to give you the Kingdom." (Lk. 12:32) God has promised us eternal life and our benevolent God

- 3. Our God is a God of Life. How does this statement assure you of your hope in God?

Challenge:


