THOUGHTS FROM OUR PASTOR



Fighting again moral complacency

What thoughts pass through our minds when we drive up to one of the many people begging on our streets? Hopefully, thoughts of compassion. However, in all honesty, other thoughts also pass through my mind: "Should I help them or pass them by?" "Are they drug addicts"? "Are they "con-artists"? "Will they use the money to just buy alcohol?" Maybe I don't really want to ask the deeper questions as to why a person is homeless and hungry to begin with. I can easily fall into a place of moral complacency, "justifying" my behavior. The Gospel this Sunday warns us to be on guard against an attitude of moral complacency. The "rich man" had everything he wanted or needed. But he was complacent and lacked compassion. He passed by Lazarus every day and saw him in his great need. Jesus used this parable to warn the Pharisees about their own complacency, especially toward the poor. Sadly, most of the Pharisees rejected Jesus and His message. It was easier for them (and for us?) to remain on our "island of complacency" than to immerse ourselves into the intense need of others. We must love God with every fiber of our being, and we are to love our neighbor as ourselves. This means that we are to treat everyone – no matter who they are – just like we want to be treated ourselves. Would we walk past ourself if we saw ourself sitting on the street begging? - Fr. Tom





Parish pilgrimage

News on the next Parish Pilgrimage will be out Soon. Stay tuned.

The historical reality of Christian empire, like Christian anti-Semitism, is bathed in irony. Jesus was an oppressed brown Palestinian Jew, living in a Middle Eastern nation occupied by a European empire centered in Rome.

Jesus challenged the empire of Rome by proclaiming an alternative empire, the empire of God. The similarity of the terms highlighted the radical contrasts between the two empires:

Rome's empire was violent.

God's empire was nonviolent.

It characterized by domination.

God's empire was service and liberation.

Rome It was preoccupied with money.

God's empire was generosity/wary of money.

Rome's empire fueled by power.

God's empire fueled by the power of love.

Powerful and violent man on the top

God's empire: network of solidarity giving. with chains of command and submission "the last, the least, and lost" honored place with everyone else beneath the leader at the table.

Not surprisingly, the Roman Empire saw Jesus and his nonviolent movement as a threat to their violent regime, so they had him tortured and publicly executed as a matter of standard procedure. By pinning a naked human being to wood ... the empire showed its own absolute dominance and its victim's absolute defeat. The message was clear: Jesus' message of truth and love meant nothing in the face of the empire's crushing power and domination....

Echoing its founder's nonviolence, the Christian faith initially grew as a nonviolent spiritual movement of counter-imperial values. It promoted love, not war. Its primal creed elevated solidarity, not oppression and exclusion: "For in Christ Jesus you are all children of God through faith. As many of you as were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ. There is no longer Jew or Greek, there is no longer slave or free, there is no longer male and female; for all of you are one in Christ Jesus" (Galatians 3:26–28).

The early Christians elevated the equality of friendship rather than the hierarchy supremacy (John 15:15; 3 John 14, 15). Because of their counter-imperial posture, including their refusal to be soldiers in the Roman army or to participate in the cult proclaiming the divinity of the emperor, they were mocked, distrusted as unpatriotic, and per-

Since Constantine, (when Christianity was proclaimed the empire's religion) Christianity has repeatedly claimed a legitimate right to do violence to its members [and others] to protect its interests and conserve its supremacy. It has sought far-reaching control over the behavior and minds of its subjects. At times, it has behaved like a totalitarian power. (Brian McLaren/CAC.org)


