With the current cost of living crisis and the general drop in entries across classes at shows CBHS Show committee works hard to try and maintain our show diary. It takes a village to raise a family and it will take every Cleveland Bay owner to ensure the survival of the breed going forward.

With that being said we were delighted to hear that Emily Fisher and Mandy Willey were able to have a trial of brand new classes for Cleveland Bays at the 120th Liskeard Agricultural show in Cornwall. This was the first time Cleveland Bay specific classes have been offered at this show. It also became the only show in the South West of England to host Breed specific classes for Cleveland Bay horses and

Pure and Part bred Cleveland bays were encouraged to enter and there was both in-hand and ridden classes available.

There were a fantastic 10 separate equines entered at the show, but following an immense heat wave and other varying circumstances, 4 Beautiful Pure Breds were in attendance on the day.

Special prizes included Best Turnout, Best Pure bred, Best Part Bred and Young horse.

# Dress Code and Turnout Guidelines

## General Guidance

Pure and part bred Cleveland Bays appearing in the show ring are representing the breed in one of its most important shop windows. It is therefore essential that those horses set a positive example that others can follow, that we can all be proud of, as they represent the breed. The CBHS Show Committee has set out the following guidelines for dress and turnout for Cleveland Bay events, both in-hand and ridden, to ensure the highest standards are achieved and to provide competitors with a consistent framework to assist them in achieving the standard expected.

## In Hand Classes

### Horses

- Manes should be neatly plaited. There is no need to plait foals.
- Tails pulled or plaited. Foals may be plaited or natural.
- Heels may be trimmed or left untrimmed if preferred.
- Horses must be shown in a plain leather bridle. Three-year olds may be shown in bits, yearlings and two-year olds in snaffles only. Foals should just have a leather headcollar.
- It is recommended that colts and stallions are shown in correctly fitting stallion tack, but this is not mandatory.
- Animals should be clean and tidy and be shod or have well-trimmed hooves. No anti concussion pads or surgical shoes are allowed.
- The CBHS discourages the showing of over fat horses and Judges will take this into consideration when making their awards.

### Handlers

- Men should wear a suit or coat and trousers, collar and tie and appropriate headgear. It is strongly recommended that protective headgear should be worn.
- Women may wear coat, skirt or trousers with a collar and tie and appropriate headgear. It is strongly recommended that protective headgear should be worn.
- Earrings and visible jewellery must not be worn.
- Any form of leather or string gloves should be worn

- A plain malacca or leather cane should be carried, the length of which should not exceed 75cm.

## Ridden Classes

### Horses

- Manes should be plaited.
- Tails pulled or plaited.
- Heels trimmed or natural
- 4-year-olds are encouraged to be shown in snaffles.
- Swales, Sam Marsh bits and Gags with double bridles are actively discouraged. Bitless bridles are not allowed.
- Martingales are not permitted in ridden classes
- The complete bridle must be unmodified, made of plain leather, without blinkers.
- Saddles should be reasonably straight cut.
- No tack may be worn which in any way conceals an animals conformation.
- All horses in classes where the Judge rides, the exhibits must be shod all round.
- No pads, or surgical shoes are allowed.
- No rugs, clothing or item of tack that reveals the identity of a horse or owner may be worn in the show ring.
- The CBHS discourages the showing of over fat horses and Judges will take this into consideration when making their awards.

### Rider

- Tweed coat for men. Tweed coat or plain blue or black coat for women.
- Collar and ordinary tie. Tie must be pinned down.
- Ordinary shirt.
- Plain fawn or buff-coloured breeches, not white.
- Plain black or brown boots.
- Garter straps. Points must face outwards, and the buckle be against and between buttons on breeches.
- Spurs should be worn by exhibitors. Spurs must always be of smooth metal. There must be a shank, pointing only towards the rear, which must be no more than 3.5cm long and without rowels. The end must be blunt and incapable of wounding a horse. If the shank is curved, the spurs must be worn only with the shank directed downwards. Roller ball spurs are allowed.
- Judges do not wear spurs.
- Any form of leather or string glove.
- Plain malacca or leather cane not exceeding 75cm.
- Earrings and visible jewellery must not be worn.

## Headwear

- Secured Skull Caps/Riding Hats that meet one of the following current Safety Standards: All PAS015, VG1, (BS)EN1384 2017, ASTM F1163 04a onwards, SNELL E2001, SNELL E2016, AS/NZS 3838 2003
- Hats should have a plain cover and may be black, navy, blue or grey. Velvet covers are encouraged.
- It should be noted that some shows enforce their own hat rules that overrule those of the CBHS affiliated classes, competitors are strongly advised to check these before entering.

# Judges and Judging

Becoming a judge for Cleveland Bay horse classes is both an honour and a responsibility. The breed holds a unique place in equine history, and those who evaluate it in the ring help safeguard its future. For anyone aspiring to judge Cleveland Bays, stewarding and continuous learning are not optional extras – they are essential foundations.

## Stewarding: The First Step Towards Judging

Serving as a steward is one of the most valuable early experiences for future judges. It offers a front-row view of ringcraft, class flow, safety protocols, and the practical expectations placed on both competitors and officials.

Through stewarding, aspiring judges learn how to manage time effectively, ensure fairness, and maintain a calm, professional atmosphere. It also provides insight into the subtle communication that happens between judge and steward – a partnership crucial to the smooth running of any show. Ultimately, stewarding builds confidence and familiarity with procedures long before an individual stands in the center of the ring as a judge.

## Learning and Development: A Continuous Process

Judging Cleveland Bays requires more than simply appreciating a beautiful horse. It demands a deep understanding of the breed standard, conformation, movement, temperament, and type.

Ongoing learning – through seminars, breed society training, mentorship, and time spent observing established judges – ensures that future judges develop consistency, breed knowledge, and a trained eye.

Because the breed is rare, each judging appointment also contributes to the promotion of the Cleveland Bay's qualities; well-educated judges help maintain the integrity and future of this historic horse.

## The Vital Role of Judges

Judges carry significant influence. Their decisions shape breeding choices, reward correct type, and help maintain high welfare and turnout standards.

A good judge represents fairness, professionalism, and dedication. They champion the breed by rewarding true Cleveland Bay characteristics and by offering constructive feedback that encourages exhibitors and breeders alike.

Judges also set the tone in the ring. Their behavior models respect, courtesy, and impartiality — qualities essential for maintaining trust within the showing community.

# 2026 HBLB Show Attendance Awards

## **HBLB Show Attendance Grant 2026**

### **Rules for clarification**

Claimants must be fully paid up members/joint members of the CBHS at the time of the event.

The claim must relate to a pure Cleveland Bay owned and specified as such in the passport (by transfer if necessary) by the claimant. (Transfers must be notified within 30 days of purchase by law) or through a loan agreement lodged with the CBHS office before the event, and current at the time of the event.

All claims are up to a maximum of £100 per owner/stud/member/joint member.  
No payment for a foal at foot with the mare.

Claims will NOT be paid out until after the last qualifying show.

Attendance Grants for 2026 will be:

- £75 for the RWHS
- £50 for the Royal Three Counties Show
- £75 for the GYS
- £15 for any other show with a CB section

Breeder grants will be awarded to the breeder of the Champion (£50) and Reserve Champion (£25) at the RWHS, Three Counties and GYS to be paid at the end of the showing season.

Weekend camps seem to have become a big commitment at this time, so we are trying a different format in a different location in order to continue the spirit of getting Bays and friends together for an educational and social gathering. We are looking forward to a day of Indoor lessons and activities, both ridden and In Hand, a spin on the gallops, (ridden only) a dressage simulator experience and plenty of socialising with all comers, whilst helping to raise the profile of our breed.

The Clinic is aimed at Grassroots level to boost confidence for you and your horse, and to improve you both in a fun and stress free environment. The Clinic is open to all - CBHS members and non-members, Cleveland Bays both pure and part bred and non (aka honorary) Cleveland Bays. This includes young horses, In Hand and Novice ridden, as the Clinic aims to be as inclusive as possible, stallions being the only exception.

We have been fortunate enough to engage the services of the two fabulous instructors Hazel Towers (5\* eventer) and Bev Walton (equine behaviourist). They were outstanding at our previous two Camps, and we are delighted that they have agreed to teach at our NRC Clinic.

The cost of the one day clinic is £75, and this includes all the facilities and at least 2 lessons/activities including a choice from flat work, pole work, desensitisation or any other requests. The price also includes a buffet lunch and drinks for the day. Toilets are provided on site.

The Gallops and the Dressage Simulator are offered as extras. The cost per person may vary depending on the number participating, but will be no more than the price quoted on the entry form.

A refundable deposit of £35 **\*\***(up to 5th May) secures your place on the Clinic with the remainder (including extras) being due by May 31st 2026.

Places will be allocated on a strictly first come, first served basis and if the Clinic is oversubscribed we will start a waiting list.
