A LITTLE HISTORY

The Arizona Cattle Growers' Association (ACGA) was founded when a small group of concerned cattlemen took it upon themselves to help structure the cattle industry's future in this great state. Their primary concern was that there be orderly, systematic laws protecting livestock and property. On January 4, 1903, these dedicated cattlemen organized ACGA.

At ACGA, our members actively promote the Arizona beef cattle industry by testifying at legislative committee meetings, serving as guest speakers at community events, and using social media to share the environmental benefits of ranching. We support a growing young rancher program. We host two annual meetings where members learn about new ranching technologies and cutting-edge research. Our members serve on boards and commissions at the local, state and national levels. We develop policy language on a variety of issues, serving as a resource to state and federal legislators.

*Fair Share is a voluntary, \$1.00 per-head financial contribution made by Cattle Producer Members in addition to base dues to support ACGA's statewide advocacy, education, and community programs. It reflects each ranch's size and ability to contribute, rather than a flat fee, and is traditionally calculated as a small amount per cow/calf pair or animal unit owned or managed. A minimum Fair Share donation of \$150 earns one additional voting membership that may be assigned to a spouse, child, foreman, etc.

TYPES OF MEMBERSHIPS

SEEKING VOTING MEMBERSHIP

CATTLE PRODUCER \$200 + FAIR SHARE

Any person, partnership, firm, or corporation breeding or producing cattle, a ranch owner, or a large animal veterinarian. Full voting rights, membership card, and all voting members benefits. *A minimum Fair Share payment of \$150 earns one additional voting membership, which may be designated to a spouse, child, foreman, etc. Cattle Producer Members also have the option to add additional non-voting associate membership such as adult children, another employee, etc. for \$100 each.

FRIEND OF THE INDUSTRY \$200

Any person, who may or may not own cattle, who is interested in the Arizona beef industry. Full voting rights, membership card, and all voting member benefits.

BUSINESS MEMBER \$450

Any state or national company or entity engaged in serving the needs of the cattle industry. Full voting rights, membership card and all voting member benefits. Business card listing in *Arizona CattleLog*, a dedicated spot on the partner tab on our website featuring your logo, business description, and a link to your company website. Opportunity to address our board meetings for 15 to 20 minutes either in person or via Zoom. Access to member contact information list of those who have granted permission. Priority consideration over non-members for booths and vendor presentations.

SEEKING NON-VOTING MEMBERSHIP

ASSOCIATE \$125

For spouses, family members, ranch employees, friends of the industry, or supporters who wish to back Arizona ranching and stay involved without voting privileges. Associates receive the monthly *Arizona Cattlelog*, the weekly *Herd That!* e-newsletter and may serve on committees.
