REFLECTION

This week we have the parable of the wedding garment. At the time of Jesus, participants in a banquet were expected to dress in clothes that were superior to those worn on ordinary days. Guests who could afford it would wear white, but it was sufficient for ordinary people to wear garments as close to white as possible. It was customary for the rich hosts to provide their guests with suitable apparel. For royal weddings, special outfits were given to any guests who could not afford to buy their own. Hence, to appear in ordinary, soiled working clothes would show contempt for the occasion, and would be an unspoken refusal to join in the King's rejoicing. This wedding story in the gospel reading teaches us that God welcomes everyone to the feast, but not everyone accepts his invitation. Those who decline God's invitation are too caught up in their affairs. They prioritize business deals and transactions over responding to God. These individuals have misplaced their priorities by valuing material needs over spiritual ones. The wedding feast had an open invitation, but there was one rule: all guests had to follow a specific dress code. In the parable, we observe the king's anger upon entering the banquet hall and discovering that one guest did not follow the dress code. This guest was promptly removed from the event. The wedding garment is a reminder of the white garment received during baptism, representing Christian dignity. Wearing the wedding garment also means living out the Gospel message. We are called to live the moral and ethical values embodied in Jesus' life in earth in flesh and time, and in his teachings. This parable reveals that God invites people to enjoy his abundance, specifically the Holy Eucharist, a banquet where many are welcome to join the Lord at the table. Accepting this gracious and generous invitation to experience true happiness is important. Life is meant to be celebrated, acknowledging the goodness and blessings provided by God. Let us lead a meaningful life worthy to be admitted in Heaven.
