Kristi had to get up at 4.00 AM on school days to do her practice in the ice rink before she went to school. This helped her to develop into a world-class figure-skater. In 1992 Kristi won the gold medal for the United States in women's figure-skating at the XVI Winter Olympics in Albertville, France, 1992! Kristi thus became one of the several examples of "the stone rejected by the builders becoming a cornerstone," in this case, of the U.S. Women's Olympic team. — Kristi is very passionate about making a positive difference in the lives of children. In 1996, Kristi established the "Always Dream Foundation" whose mission is to encourage, support and, embrace the hopes and dreams of children (Fr. Tony Kadavil). In today's Gospel, after telling the parable of the wicked tenants, Jesus prophesies that, rejected by the Jewish nation, he will become the cornerstone of the Kingdom of God.
