




Ocala Lions Club Learns About Arts in Health Ocala Metro By Diane Renyhart

Patricia Tomlison was the guest speaker at the August 14, 2025 Ocala Lions Club weekly meeting. She is the Executive Director of Arts in Health Ocala Metro (AIHOM), a nonprofit organization that supports mental and physical health through the Arts by delivering the healing power of the Arts to those who need it most. Its program has reached over 9000 area residents.

Miss Tomlinson states that art can help reduce anxiety, symptoms of depression and manage chronic pain. She stressed that it is important to keep a regular schedule of creative activities.

The founder of Arts in Health is Lisa Irwin with support from the Grace Dunlevy & Bob Levenson Foundation. Miss Tomlinson proudly announced that her organization has recently received funding through the National Endowment for the Arts (NEA). The Creative Forces Grant will support non-clinical military connected art workshops and other opportunities at the Ocala Vet Center. The goals of the grant include advancing creative expression, social connectedness, and supporting life transitions for military vets.

Arts in Health artist practitioners regularly visit the Memory Cafes at Empath Hospice of Marion County each month as part of the Nancy Renyhart Dementia Education Program. Musicians Becky Hudson and David Reinwald perform for attending caregivers and their companions, singing and dancing to the music. Artist DeNaya Wilkerson conducts art projects allowing each attendee to create a work to take home.

Miss Tomlinson has been at Arts in Health for three years and is the former curator at the Appleton. She recently received support from a local sponsor for a grant underwriting the event entitled "Move Together and Dance for All Ages." As part of the grant there is a Free Community Event with an Arts in Health dance practitioner. This program is scheduled for Saturday's 10:00-11:00 a.m. August 23-September 20 at the Heart of the Park facility at Tuscawilla Park and will be indoors.

Orange Park Lions double up service events in one week, serving both 2 legged and 4 legged friends

The group of Lions knew the third week of August was going to be a challenging week to serve the community, but several Lions came out roaring to offer help. Their first task was to serve at the Impact Clay Train in Green Cove Springs on a hot Saturday Morning. The Lions are no stranger to this monthly event haven served several times all over the county. In the past they had always helped with serving hot food and helping out with haircuts. This month was different. With the help from Staples and donations from the club, school supplies were distributed to several families just in time for the start of the school year. Another service was offered at the train for the first time. The Lion's Club is all about vision and vision screening was performed on dozens of children and adults. Results were given and if needed, information was offered on how to get additional vision assistance and how to get aid with eye exams and glasses. Vision screening will be offered at future Impact Clay Train stops. On this day at the

Two days later, another task awaited the Lions. Safe Animal Shelter at 2913 County RD. 220 in Middleburg Florida was in desperate need of food and supplies for their fast-growing feline population as well as recent additions of floppy eared k-9s. Due to area road construction, the shelter became hard to visit and traffic going by was cut to very low numbers. Carl Crosby, Vicky Crosby, Celia Vencil, Dave Vencil, Ken Groleau, Melanie Groleau, Catherine Minor, and Dave Minor from the Orange Park Lions Club stepped up and once again became needed "friends"! Hundreds of dollars' worth of cat and kitten food, dog food, blankets, supplies and a check were brought in by the group of Lions from Orange Park to help with the always growing population of animals. Time was also spent at the shelter visiting workers and the animals who were there. The shelter is always in need of forever homes and foster homes. Becoming a foster caregiver is an amazing experience where you get to take part in saving the lives of animals. To get started becoming a foster caregiver, contact the shelter.

Safe Animal Shelter is the oldest no-kill shelter in Clay County. It receives no government funding and the homeless cats and dogs they take in, are provided quality care only through private donations. Their goal is to reduce the number of cats and dogs euthanized in Clay County and NE Florida. All the great care the animals receive is all from community support. There are "wish lists" provided on Amazon and Chewy websites and on the Orange Park Lions Website what to bring when you visit the lovely animals.
