



Excellence Awards

2025-2026 Excellence Awards updates

These prestigious awards are available at four levels—club, zone, region and district. Clubs must earn a Club Excellence Award as a prerequisite for Excellence Awards at the zone, region and district level.

Applications will not be necessary for the 2025-2026 award cycle. Awards will be distributed by Lions International to clubs that meet the updated criteria and eligibility requirements.

Club Excellence Award criteria

The Club Excellence Award acknowledges the dedication and legacy of service within individual clubs and is the foundation for excellence awards presented to Zone Chairpersons, Region Chairpersons and District Governors.

Membership

- Induct a minimum of **two or 20% new members**, whichever is greater (not including transfer, reinstated or charter members). Eligibility is determined based on the club's membership count on June 30th of the previous Lion year.
- Or **sponsor** a new Lions club.

Service

• Report a **minimum of four service activitie**s to Lions International. Three of these activities must show participation in each of the three International <u>Weeks of Service</u>.

Leadership

- Report newly elected club officers in Lion Portal by May 15 of the current Lion year.
- A **minimum of 10% of the club's members** complete any three courses in the <u>Lions</u> <u>Learning Center</u>.
- The club president for the current Lion year must not have served more than two consecutive terms.
- A minimum of two or more club officers (president, vice president, secretary or treasurer. Of which, one must be the club president) complete Club Officer Training (online with the Lions Learning Center or in-person as reported by a GLT coordinator in Learn) between May 1 December 31.

Donations

• <u>Contributed to LCIF</u> a minimum of the club's membership total on June 30th of the previous Lion year, multiplied by US\$20.

Be Prepared!

Hurricane season is here. This is a reminder of the importance of being prepared—both for our families and for our communities. Disasters can strike with little warning, but preparation can make all the difference. Please share with your club and the community if needed. Here's how we can be ready:

- Have a Plan: Make sure your family knows evacuation routes and has emergency contacts.
 Consider having a telephone tree for your family and neighbors
- Build a Kit: Stock up on water, non-perishable food, flashlights, batteries, first aid supplies, and essential medications. Make sure to have a hand can opener.
- Stay Informed: Follow local weather alerts and emergency management updates. Use Facebook to mark yourself safe.
- Club Readiness: Ensure your club has an emergency response plan and is ready to support local relief efforts if needed. Have a contact person from your club to check on volunteer opportunities.
- Serve Safely: Remember—our first duty is to keep ourselves safe so we are able to serve others when the time comes.

For decades, Lions have been at the forefront of disaster relief. Let's continue that tradition by being prepared, staying strong, and serving our communities with courage and compassion.

<u>Florida will have some permanent tax-free items</u> <u>instead of hurricane tax holidays</u>

TAMPA, Fla. — The <u>2025 state budget passed</u> by the Florida legislature axes the two hurricane tax holidays. But some items will remain tax-free year-round.

Florida's two disaster preparedness holidays usually ran in June, at the beginning of hurricane season, and from August to September, with each one lasting two weeks.

This year, the budget eliminates the sales tax on certain items all year long rather than during the two-week periods.

Here are the items that will be affected:


- Batteries (AA-cell, AAA-cell, C-cell, D-cell, 6-volt and 9-volt)
- Portable generators
- Fire extinguishers, smoke detectors, alarms and carbon monoxide detectors
- Waterproof tarps
- Ground anchor systems
- · Gas/diesel fuel cans up to five gallons


