

CELEBRATIONS OF SACRAMENT

Baptism are being celebrated every **Saturday at** 10:00 am, 12:00 pm, and 2:00 pm. Please make an appointment with the Parish Office to schedule a Baptism interview and to register for the required preparation class. The preparation class is being held every second and fourth Thursday of the month at 6:30PM.

FIRST EUCHARIST: We accept children who are at least in first grade and seven years old. We have two classes: one is every Thursday from 6:45 pm to 8:00 pm and the other is every Saturday from 9:15 am to 10:30 am. Registration starts in late July or early Au-

CONFIRMATION: It is a two-year program. First Year Confirmandi meet every first and third Friday while Second Year Confirmandi meet every second and fourth Friday. Both will have a mandatory Confirmation Retreat. Regular Class time is 6:30 pm to 8:45 pm. We accept children who are at least in seventh grade and up to Junior High (eleventh grade). Registration starts in late July or early August.

Marriage: Before planning your wedding, please make an appointment with one of our priest. Marriage preparation usually takes at **least six** months period to complete.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: Extra-Ordinary Ministers of the Holy Eucharist make pastoral visit to parishioners who are sick either confined in the hospitals, skilled nursing facilities, care homes, or at the convenient of their own home. Also, it is for parishioners who are homebound, i.e. their health or medical conditions could be compromised when they leave home. Pastoral visit comprise of the respectful distribution of the Holy Eucharist to the sick; and as well, as giving them emotional, social, and spiritual support through profound and thoughtful prayers.

Anointing of the Sick: In this Church's Sacrament, through the ministry of the priest, it is Jesus who touches the sick to heal them from sin - and sometimes even from physical ailment. There is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. A careful judgment about the serious nature of the illness or frailty of old age is sufficient. To request, please call the parish office. Outside office hours, kindly call (408) 966-4612. In addition, the Sacrament is also conferred during the communal celebration at the morning Mass every first Saturday of the month.

GOSPEL MEDITATION — ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

Today's readings set a high bar for us Christian stewards, reminding us that a stewardship way of life is meant to be a challenging way of life.

In the second reading, from the Letter to the Hebrews, we are told to live as Christ lived. And how did Christ live? "For the sake of the joy that lay before Him He endured the cross." If we are tempted to complain about the sufferings we must endure in living as Christ's disciples, we are told, "In your struggle against sin you have not yet resisted to the point of shedding blood." In other words, "If you're not bleeding, what are you complaining about?" That is quite a high bar!

The Gospel reading from Luke continues this challenging theme. Our Lord tells His disciples "I have come to set the earth on fire, and how I wish it were already blazing." A couple of verses later Jesus adds, "Do you think that I have come to establish peace on the earth? No, I tell you, but rather division."

Jesus's life on this earth and the message He brought were not meant to simply make us feel good. In fact, His words can make us downright uncomfortable at times. That's because His Good News (and it is indeed good news!) is meant to change us, to make saints of us.

The stewardship way of life sets a high bar indeed. But deeply embraced, this way of life focused on God and others will make us the saints we are called to be.

THE O.C.I.A CORNER

The Order of Christian Initiation of Adults

If you are interested in being Baptized into the Catholic Faith or if you have been Baptized in a Christian Faith and are looking to join the Catholic Faith, or are looking for the other Sacraments of Initiation (First Eucharist and Confirmation) you need to register now for OCIA. We will be closing the Registration Window on 24 Aug 2025. The OCIA Process takes at least a year of participation. The Sacraments of Initiation of Adults are given at the Easter Vigil. There is much to experience in the OCIA Process! It is not just readings a book or taking a test, but a transformation of your Spiritual life, to make Jesus your personal Lord and Savior. This does not happen overnight! It is a gradual transformation and acceptance as Jesus as Our Lord and Savior.

So, if you are interested in learning more about the OCIA Process, Register and join us, you can always withdraw from the process if it does not give you what you are looking for Spiritually.

We gather on Sundays after 10 am Mass, the longer you wait the more sessions you will miss and need to make up! The OCIA is a building block type process that builds on the previous sessions, so you will still be able to join until 24 Aug 2025 after that it would be too late to receive your Sacraments at the Easter Vigil on 4 April 2026.

This Sunday 17 Aug 2025, our Topic will be "The Mass". This is a great Topic, and we explain everything about the Mass. We have a DVD and can stop it and talk about parts of the Mass as we watch it.

On Sunday 24 Aug 2025 our Topic will be "The Church Year", this will cover topics like why is the Priest waring Green? Why is Easter on different Sundays Each Year? When does the Church year begin? These and many other questions will be explained during this session.

If you see a Topic that interests you, OCIA is open to anyone in the Parish that would like to attend to learn more about their faith. If you think you might be interested in the Catholic Faith, come join us and see if it answers your questions. You can always remove yourself from the OCIA Process at any time prior to Easter.
