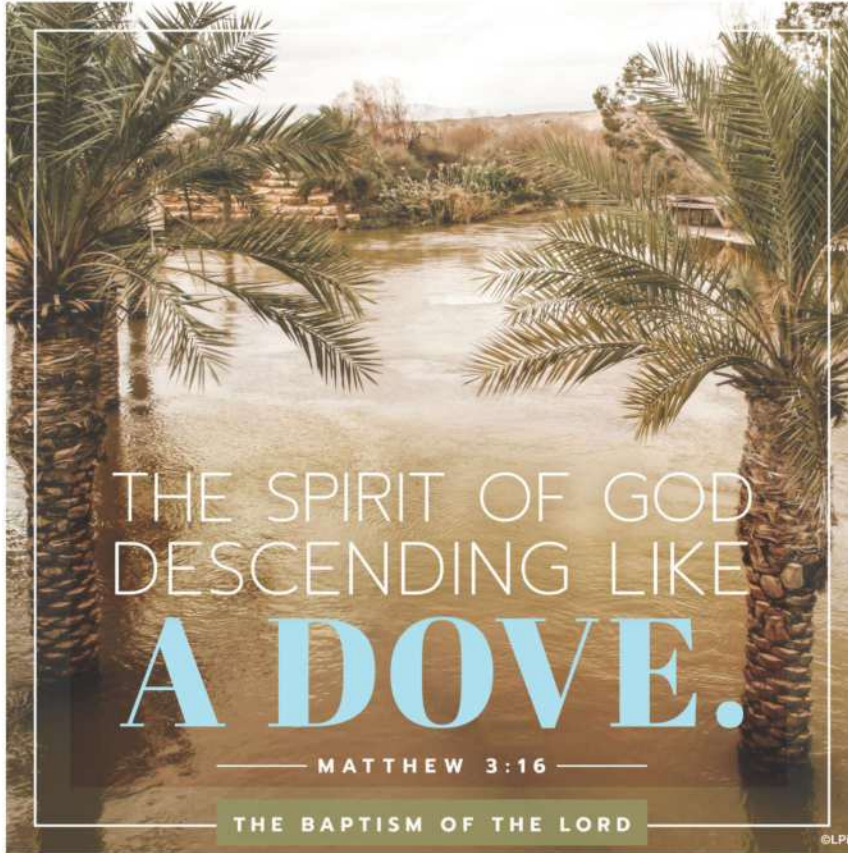

**FEAST OF THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD
JANUARY 11, 2026**

***The Challenge of Our Baptism:
To be an Agent of God's Grace for Others***



My dear St. John the Baptist Parish Family:

Today, we stand on the threshold between two seasons of the Church year. With the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, we bid farewell to the joy and light of the Christmas season and step into the steady rhythm of Ordinary Time. This moment is not just a shift in the liturgical calendar—it is a call to action, a reminder that the grace we have received through our Baptism equips us to carry Christ into the world.

The Gospel today brings us to the Jordan River, where the adult Jesus humbly enters the waters of Baptism. Though sinless, he steps into these waters not for his own sake but for ours. In this profound moment, heaven opens, the Holy Spirit descends like a dove, and the voice of the Father declares, *"You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased."*

This is not only a revelation of Jesus' identity and mission—it is a reminder of our own. Through Baptism, we too are claimed as beloved sons and daughters of God. Pope Francis beautifully expresses this truth:

"Through Baptism, we are freed from sin and reborn as children of God; we become members of Christ and are incorporated into the Church and made sharers in her mission."

What an extraordinary reality! In our Baptism, we are not only called to belong to God but also to participate in his mission of love and mercy. Yet, as Pope Francis reminded us, this mission begins with prayer, with staying connected to the source of our identity.

The spiritual renewal of every Catholic in Santa Clara County is the main priority of the Pastoral Plan of the Diocese. We will journey towards the 50th anniversary of the Diocese in 2031 spiritually refreshed, renewed and reinvigorated to be tireless cultivators of the seeds of faith in order to transform both humanity and whole cosmos (*cf. 2025 Jubilee Prayer*)

Last September 14, 2025, during my state of the parish report, I mentioned that the Diocese of San Jose would be undertaking a campaign - an ambitious and spirit-filled initiative to raise \$62 million across the Diocese of San Jose. But more than dollars and figures, this campaign is about something much deeper. It is about strengthening our parishes, deepening our life of prayer and worship, and ensuring that Christ's love continues to radiate to all corners of Santa Clara County. All 54 parishes and missions in our Diocese are united in this endeavor. Together, we are saying "yes" to the Lord's call to build up His Church for the next generation.

The grace of our Baptism is both a gift and a mission. Like Jesus, we are invited to live as God's beloved children, allowing his Spirit to empower us for the work of discipleship. This work is not always grand or extraordinary—it is often found in the simple, daily acts of love, kindness, and mercy.

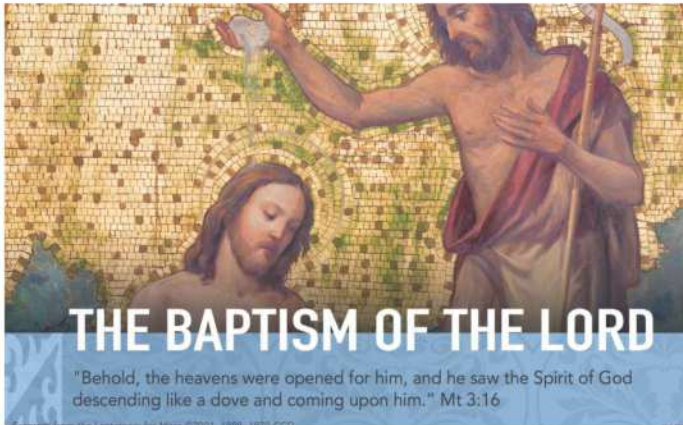
As we conclude this Christmas season and begin Ordinary Time, let us carry the light of Christ with us. Let us pray for the grace to remember who we are and whose we are. And, like Jesus, let us root our lives in prayer, trusting that God is well pleased with us, his beloved children.

May we leave here today renewed in spirit, ready to live our Baptism with courage and joy. Again as Pope Francis reminded us: *"Let us ask ourselves: How can I make the grace of my Baptism bear fruit? What does God ask of me? How can I respond to his call?"*

Together, let us strive to answer these questions with hearts full of faith and love.

May the good Lord who has begun His good work in us bring it to completion.
Happy New Year to all. May God continue to bless you and keep you safe.

GOSPEL MEDITATION

Today marks the close of the Christmas season, but before we return to Ordinary Time, we have one more great feast to celebrate — The Baptism of the Lord. Today's feast is a perfect opportunity to consider the privileges and responsibilities we all share as Christian stewards by virtue of our own Baptism.

At the moment of our Baptism, we became adopted sons and daughters of God, members of his holy, Catholic Church. Though we may not have realized it, the moment of our Baptism is also the moment we become Christian stewards, disciples of Jesus Christ, tasked with the work of following in His footsteps day by day and sharing the Gospel message with all those around us.

In our second reading from the Acts of the Apostles, St. Peter gives us a glimpse of the person of Jesus we should imitate. "He went about doing good and healing all those oppressed by the devil, for God was with him." We must live our lives like Jesus, seeking to do good to everyone we encounter; not just those in our inner circle of family and friends, but everyone in our community since the Father loves us all and Jesus sought out everyone with His saving message.

In the Gospel passage from Matthew, we see yet another aspect of Jesus in action, this time as he humbly stands before John to be baptized by him. What humility and what willingness to unite Himself to us our Lord demonstrates by this act. We can do no less as we live out our daily lives as his disciples.

And when we do strive with all our might to live out our Baptismal call to Christian stewardship, we will experience the deep honor of knowing that we, too, are God's "beloved" sons and daughters "with whom He is well-pleased."

FAITH FORMATION

CELEBRATIONS OF SACRAMENT

Baptism are being celebrated every Saturday at 10:00 am, 12:00 pm, and 2:00 pm. Please make an appointment with the Parish Office to schedule a Baptism interview and to register for the required preparation class. The preparation class is being held every second and fourth Thursday of the month at 6:30 PM.

FIRST EUCHARIST

We accept children who are at least in first grade and seven years old. We have two classes: one is every Thursday from 6:45 pm to 8:00 pm and the other is every Saturday from 9:15 am to 10:30 am. Registration starts in late July or early August.

CONFIRMATION

It is a two-year program. First Year Confirmandi meet every first and third Friday while Second Year Confirmandi meet every second and fourth Friday. Both will have a mandatory Confirmation Retreat. Regular Class time is 6:30 pm to 8:45 pm. We accept children who are at least in seventh grade and up to Junior High (eleventh grade). Registration starts in late July or early August.

MARRIAGE

Before planning your wedding, please make an appointment with one of our priest. Marriage preparation usually takes at least six months period to complete.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK

Extra-Ordinary Ministers of the Holy Eucharist make pastoral visit to parishioners who are sick either confined in the hospitals, skilled nursing facilities, care homes, or at the convenient of their own home. Also, it is for parishioners who are homebound, i.e. their health or medical conditions could be compromised when they leave home. Pastoral visit comprise of the respectful distribution of the Holy Eucharist to the sick; and as well, as giving them emotional, social, and spiritual support through profound and thoughtful prayers.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

In this Church's Sacrament, through the ministry of the priest, it is Jesus who touches the sick to heal them from sin – and sometimes even from physical ailment. There is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. A careful judgment about the serious nature of the illness or frailty of old age is sufficient. To request, please call the parish office.

Outside office hours, kindly call (408) 966-4612. In addition, the Sacrament is also conferred during the communal celebration at the morning Mass every first Saturday of the month.
