## PASTOR'S MESSAGE

EASTER SUNDAY OF THE LORD'S RESURRECTION

APRIL 5, 2026

CHRIST HAS DIED

CHRIST IS RISEN

CHRIST WILL COME AGAIN.



*My dear St. John the Baptist Parish Community,*

At Mass, we used to proclaim the mystery of our faith after consecration: **Christ has died; Christ is risen; Christ will come again.**

Those are three statements of memories. Our faith does not deny nor negate the pain of death: It was necessary for the Christ to undergo death. To the two disciples on the road to Emmaus, he said: *"Was it not necessary that the Messiah should suffer these things and enter into his glory?"* (cf. Lk 24:26). His death on the cross gave meaning to all deaths. Without that single death-event, all deaths would have been meaningless. We enter into life and exit out of it just floating into nowhere - according to our faith, we enter into hell - the place of death.

But we also proclaim that Christ is risen. This is the great mystery that makes our living meaningful and full of hope. We look forward to a like resurrection. As St. Paul says: *"we who believe in Christ live with Christ; if we are buried with him by likeness to his death, so shall we rise with him by likeness to his resurrection"* (Rom 6:4-5).

At the Eucharist, we encounter the Risen Lord who left us his Body and Blood as food for the journey. This is the day that the Lord has made. We are called to profess our faith in Jesus as the resurrection and the life.

The disciples would be gifted with a memory that began in the celebration of the Eucharist, made real in his suffering and death on Calvary, and immortalized and made mystical through the resurrection. And so every time, they and the communities that came after them would gather, the memory becomes alive.

The death of Jesus became the principle of all our living. His serenity and peace became the source of strength for disciples whose hearts were troubled.

I wish you all the blessings of a glorious Easter. I love being your pastor because of the depth of your faith and the immensity of your love.

God bless you. Happy Easter.

## FAITH FORMATION

### CELEBRATIONS OF SACRAMENT

Baptism are being celebrated every Saturday at 10:00 am, 12:00 pm, and 2:00 pm. Please make an appointment with the Parish Office to schedule a Baptism interview and to register for the required preparation class. The preparation class is being held every second and fourth Thursday of the month at 6:30 PM.

### FIRST EUCHARIST

We accept children who are at least in first grade and seven years old. We have two classes: one is every Thursday from 6:45 pm to 8:00 pm and the other is every Saturday from 9:15 am to 10:30 am. Registration starts in late July or early August.

### CONFIRMATION

It is a two-year program. First Year Confirmandi meet every first and third Friday while Second Year Confirmandi meet every second and fourth Friday. Both will have a mandatory Confirmation Retreat. Regular Class time is 6:30 pm to 8:45 pm. We accept children who are at least in seventh grade and up to Junior High (eleventh grade). Registration starts in late July or early August.

### MARRIAGE

Before planning your wedding, please make an appointment with one of our priest. Marriage preparation usually takes at least six months period to complete.

### PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK

Extra-Ordinary Ministers of the Holy Eucharist make pastoral visit to parishioners who are sick either confined in the hospitals, skilled nursing facilities, care homes, or at the convenient of their own home. Also, it is for parishioners who are homebound, i.e. their health or medical conditions could be compromised when they leave home. Pastoral visit comprise of the respectful distribution of the Holy Eucharist to the sick; and as well, as giving them emotional, social, and spiritual support through profound and thoughtful prayers.

### ANOINTING OF THE SICK

In this Church's Sacrament, through the ministry of the priest, it is Jesus who touches the sick to heal them from sin – and sometimes even from physical ailment. There is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. A careful judgment about the serious nature of the illness or frailty of old age is sufficient. To request, please call the parish office. Outside office hours, kindly call (408) 966-4612. In addition, the Sacrament is also conferred during the communal celebration at the morning Mass every first Saturday of the month.

### Why do we do that? Catholic Life Explained

#### Question:

Why is the Easter season so long? And should we be doing something special for it?

#### Answer:

You've probably noticed the priest continuing to wear white vestments at the Sunday liturgy. While we celebrated Christ's resurrection several weeks ago, the Easter season extends fifty days — just over seven weeks — from Easter Sunday to Pentecost. For most of that time — about six weeks — Jesus is still with the disciples, teaching and encouraging them. The Easter season isn't just a celebration of when Jesus is with us. At the Last Supper, Jesus promised to send an "advocate" or "counselor" when he left. At the Ascension, he directs the disciples to await "power from on high" — the coming of the Holy Spirit. The Ascension completes the Paschal Mystery, beginning with Jesus' suffering and death and continuing in the resurrection. But the Holy Spirit ushers in a new era for the Church.

After spending weeks in prayer, fasting, and service during Lent, it may seem odd that we don't widely have similar practices for Easter. That doesn't mean you can't embrace the season! Commit to taking moments of little joy throughout the weeks, like random acts of kindness towards others. Consider reading the Acts of the Apostles to learn more about the early Church or picking up an Easter devotional to pray with. He is still risen indeed!
