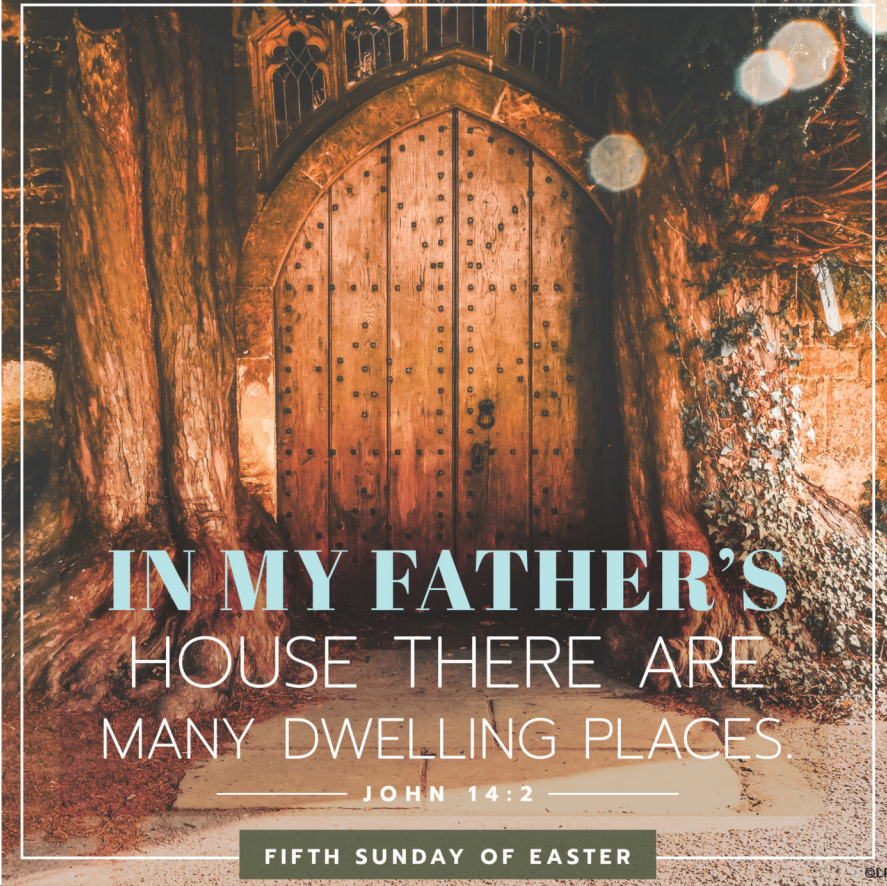

## PASTOR'S MESSAGE

**OUR LADY OF PEACE AND GOOD VOYAGE**

**MAHAL NA BIRHEN NG ANTIPOLO**



**My dear St. John the Baptist Parish Community,**

This coming Tuesday, May 5<sup>th</sup>, we will celebrate the Feast of Our Lady of Antipolo with a solemn High Mass to be led by Bishop Andy Ligot at 7 p.m. I am printing below the introduction and historical notes that will be shared at the Mass.

In Antipolo, the Philippines, one finds the religious shrine of Our Lady of Peace and Good Voyage, popularly known as the **Virgin of Antipolo** ("Birhen ng Antipolo"). The origin of our Virgin of Antipolo dates back to the Spanish era, when galleon trade between the Philippines and Mexico was at its height. On March 25, 1626, Don Juan Niño de Tabora left the shores of Mexico aboard El Almirante to make its voyage to the Philippines. On this trip, Governor Tabora brought along the brown image of our Blessed Virgin Mother. It is said that the events surrounding the safe voyage, the Blessed Virgin was named *Nuestra Señora de la Paz y Buen Viaje*.

The Jesuits built the first Antipolo church in 1591, and it was damaged by war and earthquakes in the 1600s and 1800s. During the Japanese occupation, the Blessed Image of our Lady of Antipolo was evacuated to the mountains of Angono, then at Santolan. The five hundred people who journeyed with the Brown Virgin all felt safe through their trips along steep mountain trails. For a while, the Blessed Virgin was housed in the Ocampo residence at Quiapo, previous to its transfer to the Quiapo Church where it stayed until October 15, 1945, then finally got transferred to its original and permanent sanctuary at the Church of Antipolo.

The church was destroyed during the Second World War, and a new shrine was built in 1954, declared the **National Shrine to Our Lady of Peace and Good Voyage** on January 14 of the same year by the Catholic Bishops Conference of the Philippines. The Diocese of Antipolo was canonically erected on June 25, 1983.

When Bishop Oscar Cantú made a pilgrimage to the Philippines in January 2023, on the occasion of the 500<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Christianization of the Philippines, one of the sites they visited was the Shrine of the Virgin of Antipolo. It is under the title *Nuestra Señora de la Paz y Buen Viaje* (Our Lady of Peace and Good Voyage) that the Blessed Mother is invoked as patroness of migrant Filipinos.

Then rector of the Shrine, Fr. Reynante Tolentino, committed to donate an image of the **Virgin of Antipolo** to the Diocese of San Jose, after having been informed that, for many years, we have a diocesan devotion to the Blessed Mother. Fr. Tolentino delivered the image of the Virgin Mother to the Diocese and celebrated a Mass on April 3, 2024 wherein he entrusted the Statue to the Diocese of San Jose. Bishop Oscar Cantú celebrated a pontifical Mass to officially welcome the Image of the **Virgin of Antipolo** to the Diocese at Our Lady of Peace Church in Santa Clara. The Image remained at Our Lady of Peace for a short time and made a pilgrimage to different parishes in the Diocese where there are large Filipino parishioners until She settled here in our parish.

This year marks 400 years since the arrival of the miraculous image in the Philippines, as well as the centennial year of her canonical coronation in 1926. To mark this historic milestone, 2026 was declared a jubilee year in the Diocese of Antipolo in the Philippines and was formally inaugurated on January 14 with a Holy Mass at the Antipolo Cathedral. Bishop Ruperto Santos of the Diocese of Antipolo and rector of the Cathedral urged the faithful to make this momentous celebration a call to become pilgrims of the Catholic faith, to pray and walk with a strengthened heart and with a renewed spirit.

As we witness the generations of devotion and the families who have carried the faith through trials and triumphs, we here at **St. John the Baptist Parish** also witness the quiet miracles of everyday life that we experience with Our Lady of Antipolo. On Tuesday, May 5, together with our diocesan community, we celebrate her Feast Day. Come and join us.

### WEEK 3

#### Becoming One Body: How the Mass Begins

The Mass does not begin when the priest reaches the altar. It starts at the moment we walk through the church doors and even before, as we prepare our hearts at home. The entrance **procession** gathers us into one body and prepares us to hear God's word and receive His Body and Blood. Those who process in, the altar servers, the deacons, and finally the priest *in persona Christi*, do so on behalf of the whole assembly, because the liturgy is always the action of the whole Church.

The entrance procession is rich with meaning. The **crucifix**, the cross bearing the body of Christ, leads the way, inviting all to follow him to the altar of sacrifice and resurrection. Two **candle bearers** follow, and their flames symbolize the Light of the World, Jesus Christ. Most significantly, the **Book of the Gospel** is carried with dignity and reverence, held high for all to see. This is not just any book. Every word IS Christ. As John 1:1 states: "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God." When the deacon or lector carries the Book of the Gospel in procession, they carry Christ Himself.

As the procession moves through the church, we sing the **gathering song**. This is the first time in the Mass where the assembly joins as one voice. It is the sound of all people gathered by the Lord from different parts of the community, with all their joys and burdens, united in one act of worship. Even if you think you cannot sing, your voice matters. Saint Paul reminds us that every part of the Body is important (1 Cor. 12). The Church needs to hear you praising God.

At the end of the procession, the priest **reverences the altar** with a kiss. This ancient gesture shows honor to the sacrifice of Christ so that we may have eternal life. These opening moments—the procession, the reverence, the gathering song—transform us from a group of individuals into the Body of Christ, united in worship.

This week, pay attention to how the Mass begins. Notice the crucifix, the candles, and the Book of the Gospel. Join in the entrance song with full voice. Feel yourself becoming part of something much larger than yourself—the family of God, gathered at the table of the Lord.
