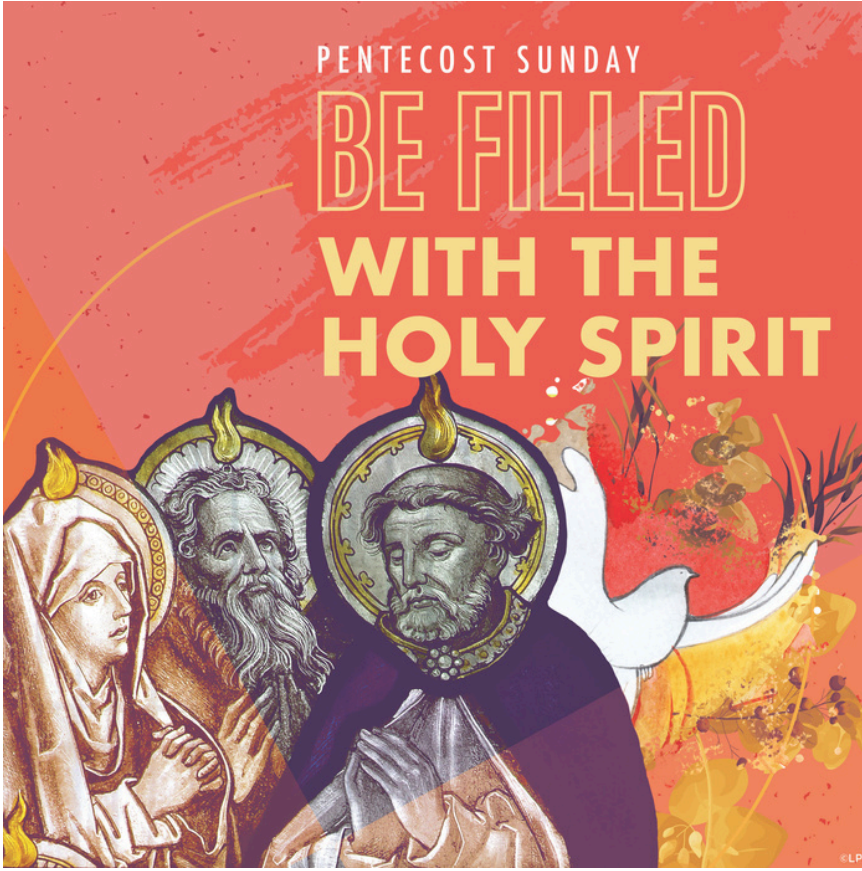

**PASTOR'S MESSAGE**  
**SOLEMNITY OF PENTECOST**  
**MAY 24, 2026**



**HAPPY BIRTHDAY, CHURCH!**

*My dear St. John the Baptist Parish Community,*

Today, we celebrate the feast of the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and the Blessed Mother. We recall today the birth of the Church.

In the Church's liturgical calendar, we celebrate the nativity of Jesus on December 25th, that of the Blessed Mother on September 8th and the birth of St. John the Baptist on June 24.

On Pentecost, fifty days after Easter, we celebrate the birth of the Church, our mystical Mother and the Bride of Christ. We celebrate her coming to birth, accompanied by the birth pangs of fear and isolation, guilt and despair, huddled in the Upper Room, the same place they celebrated the last Passover and the first Eucharist.

Pentecost this year happens to be the eve of Memorial Day. That is why there are seasonal sales at the malls and department stores. Many people have gone on holiday this weekend, not because it is Pentecost but because it is a long holiday weekend. Otherwise, Pentecost would have gone unnoticed. No birthday cake, no balloons, no gifts to unwrap, no singing.

The gospel event described by St. John happened on the night of the first Easter - the Risen Jesus breathing onto the fearful disciples the gift of the Holy Spirit which brought them peace and forgiveness, which they were to impart to others in the sacrament of forgiveness and healing. It was the same Upper Room where three nights before they celebrated the Passover meal with Jesus' Last Supper. As he then assured them of his love for them and prayer for their unity, now he offers them the gift of peace and forgiveness by breathing into them the gift of the Spirit.

From then on, the Holy Spirit has always been active in the lives of the disciples and followers of Jesus, in the life of the Church.

Many of us tend to think that the Holy Spirit is the silent member of the Holy Trinity, that there is no recorded message in the scriptures by the third person of the blessed Trinity.

Yet in reality, he is not without a voice. For he has spoken volumes through the words and works of believers throughout the world through the centuries.

Moments after his descent, the Spirit gave the disciples a voice - a voice that could not be contained in that upper room. A voice that needed to be spread to the wider world.

Our tradition tells us that Pentecost began 50 days after Easter. But nowhere in scripture does it say it ever ended. It goes on.

Pentecost can't be stopped. And we see the fruits and gifts of the Holy Spirit in what is best about the Church. We Christians have been around for 2,000 years. But know this: the Holy Spirit is just getting started.

***Come Holy Ghost, creator blest, and in our hearts take up thy rest.***

Despite our problems, our weaknesses, our broken parts and sinful history, the Spirit continues to abide with us, support us, uplift us, encourage us. He raises up popes and saints, missionaries and martyrs, nuns and monks, priests and deacons, married men and women, single individuals, yes even the young - countless witnesses to God's goodness in the world, a great cloud of witnesses that includes, incredibly, each of us.

So, Happy Pentecost. Happy birthday of the Church. Savor the abundant gifts and graces of this day. Celebrate this day and give it its due. Remember God's never-ending love for the human race and the Holy Spirit's untiring commitment to us.

But remember, too, that it is more than just one day. On one day 20 centuries ago, fire in the shape of tongues fell. And it hasn't stopped burning.

## *Renewed at the Table of the Lord*

*Liturgical Renewal Phase 1 – Introductory Rites: Welcoming & Participation*  
*Sunday after Easter, April 12, 2026 – July 1, 2026*

### WEEK 6

#### The Seasons of Our Lives in Christ

The Introductory Rites conclude with the **Collect**, also called the Opening Prayer. After a brief moment of silence, a time for us to gather our personal intentions, the priest prays on behalf of the entire assembly, collecting all our prayers into one, a reminder that we are not isolated individuals. As one, unified body, our prayers rise together to the Father.

But there is something else important about the Collect: it changes throughout the year. The prayers reflect the liturgical season. During the Easter season, the prayers proclaim Christ's resurrection and our new life in Him. During Advent, they help us prepare for His coming. In Lent, they call us to conversion. In Ordinary Time, the prayers guide us in living out our baptismal call day by day.

This is the beauty of the **Liturgical Year**, it forms a divine rhythm—Advent, Christmas, Lent, Easter, Ordinary Time—that mirrors the seasons of nature and our own lives. Times of preparation. Times of celebration. Times of beginnings, growth, death, and resurrection. Notice, too, how the Gloria disappears during Advent and Lent, seasons of waiting and penance. Then it returns on Christmas and Easter with even greater joy. The liturgical year teaches us to trust God's timing, knowing He is present in every season of our lives.

Over these past weeks, we have journeyed together through the opening moments of the Mass. We have learned that our participation matters, that music is prayer, and that unity in worship strengthens our mission. When we come to Mass with humility, honesty, and trust in the Lord, we open ourselves to God's transformative grace, and we are sent forth by God, having been renewed, ready to bring Christ's love to the world.

As we continue our **liturgical renewal**, let us always remember what we have learnt about those early moments of the Mass. Let the mystery of Christ's action in gathering his people take root in your heart. We might be tempted to rush through familiar words and gestures, but if we pause, we see they are the liturgy's first moments of encounter—pointing us toward the greatest encounter of the Mass: Christ in the Eucharist. All of us were chosen to be there on that day, for a reason: Christ has something he wants to tell each of us personally. May we be renewed, truly **Renewed at the Table of the Lord**, now and always.
