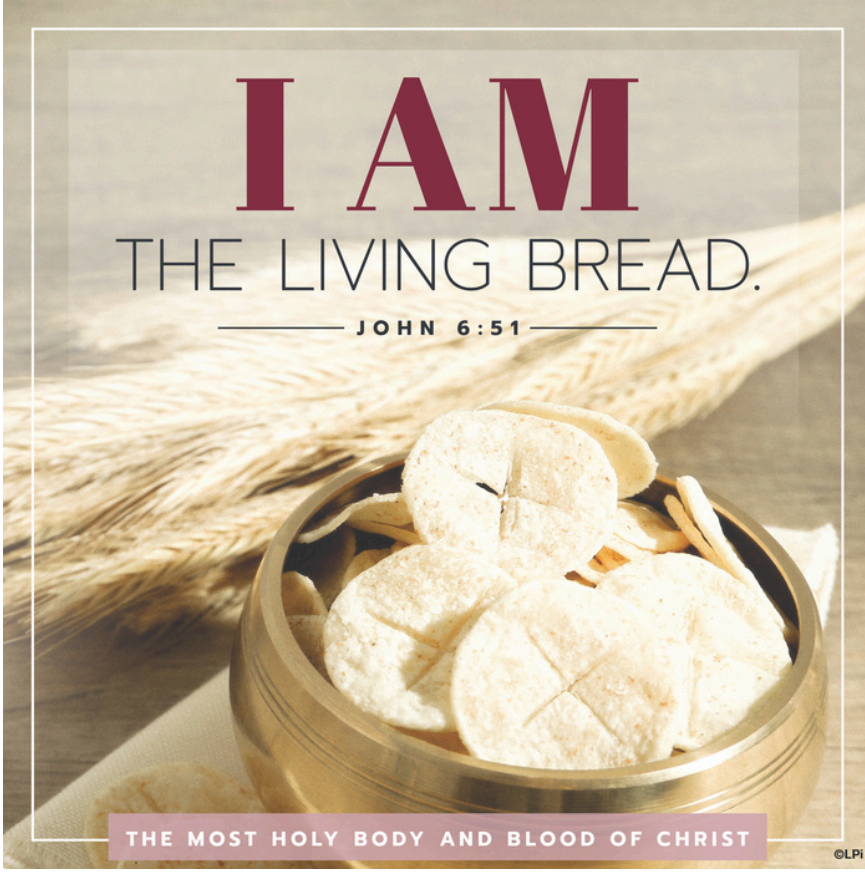

DO THIS IN MEMORY OF ME

My dear St. John the Baptist Parish Community,

The late beloved Pope Francis spoke eloquently about this feast of Corpus Christi in one of his Angelus messages. "Many of us come to Mass carrying heavy burdens. Some are battling anxiety, depression, or grief. Some are struggling to make ends meet. Others are lonely, feeling forgotten or unseen—even within their own families or communities. Some are searching for purpose, for healing, for hope.

And in all of this, Jesus says, "**Come to me. Let me feed you.**"

Just like the crowds in the gospels, we are hungry. Maybe not for bread, but for peace, for direction, for connection—for something lasting. Jesus doesn't just meet our needs once and walk away. He feeds us again and again, not with food that perishes, but with Himself—food that transforms.

And notice what He does with that bread:

He **takes, blesses, breaks, and gives**. This is more than a ritual. It's a pattern for Christian living.

God **takes us**—just as we are, with all our weaknesses and gifts.

He **blesses us**, even when we feel unworthy.

He **breaks us**—yes, sometimes through trials, loss, or suffering—but always with a purpose.

And He **gives us**—sends us out—to nourish others. And so the Eucharist is not just something we receive. It's something we become.

We are called to be the Body of Christ—for the life of the world.

That means being broken open for others. It means forgiving when it's hard. It means standing with the poor, the sick, the marginalized.

It means noticing the people no one else sees. It means praying when you're tired, serving when it's inconvenient, loving when it costs you something.

So today, let's not just listen with our ears—but with our lives.

Let's allow Christ to *take us, bless us, break us, and give us*. Let's remember—not just with our minds, but with our hands, our hearts, our choices. Let us become what we receive:

The Body of Christ, for a world aching for love, justice, and meaning.

FAITH FORMATION

CELEBRATIONS OF SACRAMENT

Baptism are being celebrated every Saturday at 10:00 am, 12:00 pm, and 2:00 pm. Please make an appointment with the Parish Office to schedule a Baptism interview and to register for the required preparation class. The preparation class is being held every second and fourth Thursday of the month at 6:30 PM.

FIRST EUCHARIST

We accept children who are at least in first grade and seven years old. We have two classes: one is every Thursday from 6:45 pm to 8:00 pm and the other is every Saturday from 9:15 am to 10:30 am. Registration starts in late July or early August.

CONFIRMATION

It is a two-year program. First Year Confirmandi meet every first and third Friday while Second Year Confirmandi meet every second and fourth Friday. Both will have a mandatory Confirmation Retreat. Regular Class time is 6:30 pm to 8:45 pm. We accept children who are at least in seventh grade and up to Junior High (eleventh grade). Registration starts in late July or early August.

MARRIAGE

Before planning your wedding, please make an appointment with one of our priest. Marriage preparation usually takes at least six months period to complete.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK

Extra-Ordinary Ministers of the Holy Eucharist make pastoral visit to parishioners who are sick either confined in the hospitals, skilled nursing facilities, care homes, or at the convenient of their own home. Also, it is for parishioners who are homebound, i.e. their health or medical conditions could be compromised when they leave home. Pastoral visit comprise of the respectful distribution of the Holy Eucharist to the sick; and as well, as giving them emotional, social, and spiritual support through profound and thoughtful prayers.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

In this Church's Sacrament, through the ministry of the priest, it is Jesus who touches the sick to heal them from sin – and sometimes even from physical ailment. There is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. A careful judgment about the serious nature of the illness or frailty of old age is sufficient. To request, please call the parish office.

Outside office hours, kindly call (408) 966-4612. In addition, the Sacrament is also conferred during the communal celebration at the morning Mass every first Saturday of the month.
