CELEBRATIONS OF SACRAMENT

Baptism are being celebrated every **Saturday at 10:00 am, 12:00 pm, and 2:00 pm.** Please make an appointment with the Parish Office to schedule a Baptism interview and to register for the required preparation class. The preparation class is being held every second and fourth Thursday of the month at 6:30PM.

FIRST EUCHARIST: We accept children who are at least in first grade and seven years old. We have two classes: one is every Thursday from 6:45 pm to 8:00 pm and the other is every Saturday from 9:15 am to 10:30 am. Registration starts in late July or early August.

CONFIRMATION: It is a two-year program. First Year Confirmandi meet every first and third Friday while Second Year Confirmandi meet every second and fourth Friday. Both will have a mandatory Confirmation Retreat. Regular Class time is 6:30 pm to 8:45 pm. We accept children who are at least in seventh grade and up to Junior High (eleventh grade). Registration starts in late July or early August.

Marriage: Before planning your wedding, please make an appointment with one of our priest.

Marriage preparation usually takes at **least six months** period to complete.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: Extra-Ordinary Ministers of the Holy Eucharist make pastoral visit to parishioners who are sick either confined in the hospitals, skilled nursing facilities, care homes, or at the convenient of their own home. Also, it is for parishioners who are homebound, i.e. their health or medical conditions could be compromised when they leave home. Pastoral visit comprise of the respectful distribution of the Holy Eucharist to the sick; and as well, as giving them emotional, social, and spiritual support through profound and thoughtful prayers.

Anointing of the Sick: In this Church's Sacrament, through the ministry of the priest, it is Jesus who touches the sick to heal them from sin – and sometimes even from physical ailment. There is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. A careful judgment about the serious nature of the illness or frailty of old age is sufficient. To request, please call the parish office. Outside office hours, kindly **call (408) 966-4612**. In addition, the Sacrament is also conferred during the communal celebration at the morning Mass every first Saturday of the month.

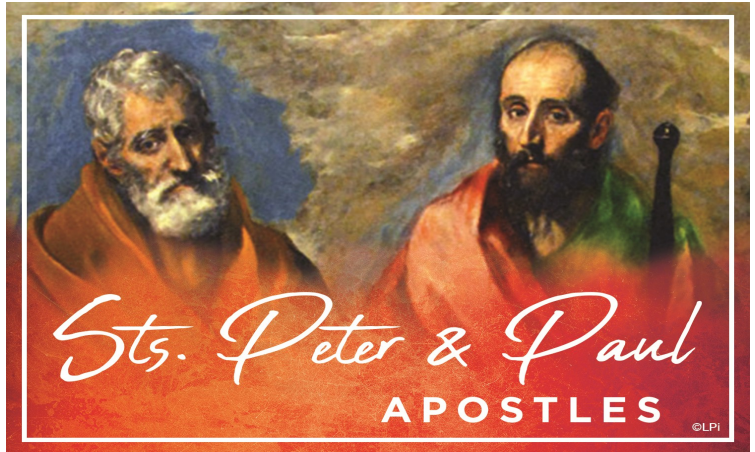

GOSPEL MEDITATION — ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

During June, we have celebrated key moments in the life of the Church — Pentecost, the Most Holy Trinity, Corpus Christi — culminating today with the Solemnity of Sts. Peter and Paul. Though very different men, they are united in faith, mission, and martyrdom, and the Church has honored them together since the third century.

St. Peter, the first Pope, was chosen by Christ as the rock on which the Church would be built. The Catechism tells us that because of the faith he professed, Peter remains the "unshakeable rock of the Church." Despite his human weaknesses, Peter's loyalty, repentance, and leadership make him a powerful model of stewardship.

St. Paul, once a persecutor of Christians, became one of the Church's greatest evangelists. In today's second reading, Paul reflects on his mission, saying, "I have finished the race... the crown of righteousness awaits me." The Greek word he used for "crown" — *stephanos* — refers to a victor's crown, not a royal one, showing his view of faith as a race well-run for the sake of Christ.

Though they were martyred separately, tradition holds that Peter and Paul were in Rome at the same time, and their shared witness and sacrifice tie them closely together in Church history. They embody two vital aspects of stewardship — Peter in his faith and leadership, and Paul in his zeal and wisdom.

As stewards, we are called to follow their example — to build the Church through our commitment, to overcome our failures through God's mercy, and to proclaim the Gospel with courage. Like Peter and Paul, we are invited to give all we have for the sake of Christ and His Church.

ORDER of CHRISTIAN INITIATION of ADULTS (OCIA)

Are YOU ready to begin your journey of Faith?

- We normally meet once a week, starting on a Wednesday evening and later moving to Sunday after the 10:00 AM Mass.
- The Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (O.C.I.A.) serves as a spiritual pathway for those seeking to deepen their relationship with God and join the Catholic Church. It encompasses a journey of faith, reflection, and community, guiding participants through the teachings, traditions, and sacraments necessary for full integration into the Christian life. The O.C.I.A Process is a year long program that begins in early summer.
- Our discussions are scheduled topics that are focused on becoming closer to Jesus Christ and His Church. Sometimes we have activities like making our own Advent Wreaths.
- Our Easter Retreat helps us reflect on the events of Easter Week.
- At the Easter Vigil Mass we receive our Sacraments of Initiation, Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Eucharist.
- Our Sessions usually last about 90 minutes so on Sundays we are finished by 1:00 PM.
- The Process of the OCIA is divided into four groups: The Inquiry Phase, where we get to the basics of the Catholic Faith, Jesus, The Trinity, The Bible, a tour of the Church; the next Phase (if you choose to continue) is the Catechumenate Phase, this is where we take a closer look at things like the Sacraments of the Catholic Church, who's who in the leadership of the Church; If you chose to continue, we enter the Enlightenment Phase. You will be accepted by the Bishop as candidates to receive the Sacraments of Initiation at the Easter Vigil, we will have extra Sessions attending Saturday Mass, The Stations of the Cross, a Retreat, and the services of Holy Week. During the period of Enlightenment, you would be asked to commit to signing the Book of the Elect, stating your intentions of entering the Catholic Faith at the Easter Vigil Mass. Finally, we have our last Phase which is called Mystagogy, which is a series of Sessions on what your place is in the Catholic Church, what is expected of you in service, what Ministries are available to you and to help you get settled into your new Faith Community.

Why is the OICA starting in July? The process and sessions start based on when Easter is. This year we had a late Easter, next year it is earlier. The instructions given to us are that the OCIA Process should last at least a full Liturgical Year. The schedule of Sessions will be posted on the Bulletin Board at the front of the Church Sunday 28 June 2025.

Who can the OCIA Process help?

Anyone who wants to know more about the Catholic faith. We can help those that have never been baptized in any Religion, we can also help those Baptized in another Christian Religion, even those who we Baptized as a child but never received any other Sacraments. Confirmation Program

Online registration for our **Confirmation program** is now open. It is a two-year program. We accept candidates who are in 7th grade through 11th grade. An information or orientation night will be held on August 29 at 7 pm in the church. Classes will begin on September 5 for first-year Confirmation (and every 1st and 3rd Fridays of the month) and on September 12 for second-year Confirmation (and every 2nd and 4th Fridays of the month).
