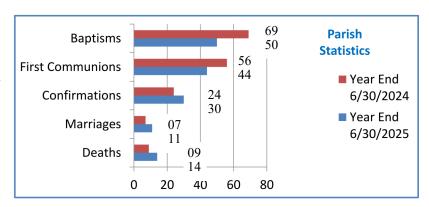
St. Sylvester Parish Annual Report July 1, 2024 to June 30, 2025

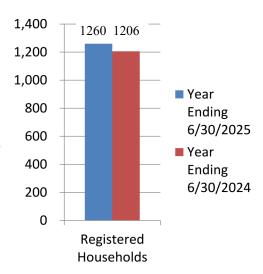

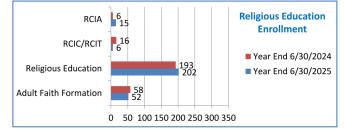

Last year, our parish not only met the Diocesan goal but exceeded expectations, resulting in a remarkable rebate of \$39,564.47 returned to us. This achievement highlights the exceptional generosity of our parishioners and reflects our community's commitment to supporting both diocesan and parish initiatives. Our parish's history of consistent rebates is a testament to the ongoing dedication and spirit of giving among our members. The funds rebated to us help finance parish projects, outreach, and improvements, making a meaningful impact on our community.

For the current CSA campaign, we are experiencing record-breaking support. To date, we have received \$200,156 in pledges from 387 parishioners—more than any previous year. This unprecedented level of participation demonstrates our parish's unwavering generosity and commitment to the mission of the Diocese.

Already, we have received a rebate of \$16,732.72 back to our parish for this campaign cycle, thanks to early and robust contributions from our parishioners.

The rebated funds allow us to pursue new opportunities for growth, service, and ministry within our parish community.

Income Statement and New Budget

We concluded the fiscal year with a net loss of \$6,922.43. Similar to last year, the end result was a net loss, although our projections had initially anticipated a larger deficit. This year's financials were impacted by several unexpected, costly maintenance items that contributed to the overall loss.

The budget for the current year shows an improvement, forecasting a net income of \$5,003.89. While this is not a substantial profit, it is a notable turnaround compared to the prior years' budgeted losses. The focus moving forward will be to identify and implement cost-saving measures wherever possible, with the goal of ending the year with an even greater profit than currently budgeted.

By continuing to manage expenses and seek efficiencies, there is optimism for exceeding the budgeted profit and strengthening the financial position at year-end.
