

A message from the Pastor

Being Tireless in Our Faith

This week we hear two stories of being tireless in our faith. In the first reading, Moses was raising up his arms so that the Israelites could win the battle with Amelek and his army. As long as his arms were raised, his people would be winning. And when his arms got tired, his people were losing. So, Moses sought help—he asked Aaron and Hur to support his arms. And they won! And in the gospel we hear of the widow who tirelessly keeps pestering the judge to render her a just decision against her adversary. Finally, the judge gives her what she wants—justice—simply to get her to stop bothering him. In both of these stories, I believe we hear a call to be tireless in our faith, to not give up believing, and to trust that God who is so much better than a dishonest judge, and so he will, of course, hear our cries and answer us. I believe it is also a call to seek help when our spirits are drooping. In these challenging times, when we feel like our dignity and perhaps our presence in this country are under siege, we have to tirelessly work together to bring about justice. We have to keep praying and asking God for what we want and need. We also have to keep coming together to help keep our spirits from drooping.

I want to thank all who helped make it the joyful celebration it was.
