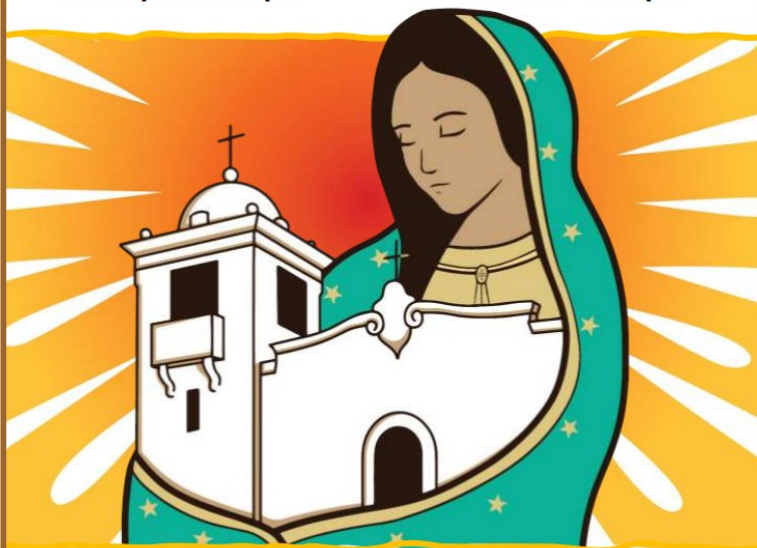

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A message from the Pastor

What is the worth of a person?

This question has come up for me recently. And it comes up in the readings today, especially the first reading. The Prophet Amos is quoting the words of someone in his time with power and money, who is contemplating how to make even more money. The most scandalous part of their thinking is how they value of others, and how little they value the poor: "We will buy the lowly for silver, and the poor for a pair of sandals." Imagine that. Thinking that you could buy a person for the price of some huaraches.

The great temptation of our times is to think that we humans get to decide the value of another person's life, or to think that any of us is somehow less than another person.

I believe this is the greatest temptation to sin. That is what is so completely wrong about the death penalty—when we decide that another person's life is not worth living. It is what is so evil about the assassination of a public figure, like we saw last week, or the murder of someone in secret. One person or group of persons never gets to set the value of a person's life.

It is a danger of our immigration system. While Catholic teaching says that of course a country is entitled to have borders and protect them, and while I completely understand the need for immigration laws, albeit they need to be just and humane, the great temptation for a person showing up to defend their right to be in this county is that they can begin to doubt their very worth. I witness people showing up in the federal courts in downtown San Diego. They are from all countries and cultures. They come fearful, worried that their future in our country may change. And my greatest worry is that they will believe that their worth as people is up for grabs, that someone will decide they cannot stay and so that therefore they believe the blatant lie that their worth is less than another. The second reading, to Timothy reminds us of the truth: God wills everyone to be saved, and Jesus Christ "gave himself as ransom for all." The One who decides our worth is God and God alone. Our worth as God's sons and daughters is infinite. That is the truth. May it guide us in these times.
