2024/25 is the year that we continued to be recognised for our good (and now even better) standard of education. This year we also received a J1 from SIAMs, demonstrating our effective status as a proud Church of England school. The year 6 results(unvalidated) are better than ever with all single subjects reaching above 64% of the students getting a scaled score of 100 or above. The final combined score being 24% higher than the year before, with more children than ever reaching the expected standard in Reading, Writing and Maths. It is also the year that over 20% of the year 6 cohort reached Greater Depth in Reading and Maths!

As always, we at St Peter's believe that by developing knowledge and skills in a wide range of areas and through a breadth of experiences, our children will be successful in life.

With all the hard work, there has also been a lot of fun... from World Book Day dressing up, to trips and experiences and a load of fundraising fun, we have done what we do best and that is achieve LOTS TOGETHER.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all the staff for their dedication and care of the children every day. It is not an easy job, but my goodness is it fun! It goes without saying that you, our faithful, supportive parents need your own shout- out!

Safe


- I know how to stay safe when travelling to and from school.


