
HOW CAN YOU SUPPORT YOUR CHILD'S LEARNING AT HOME?

Certificates- STAR awards, Maths awards and English will be awarded weekly.




Postcards home- Subject Leaders will send postcards home for excellent learning in lessons and books! They are very special indeed.

As a school, we can offer a food bank voucher (subject to conditions). We can also offer small food parcels (subject to availability).


