Thank you so much for supporting this event! 48 people signed in to join us for our first Celebration service and then went to class to see how we do it at St Peter's.




STRONG START TO LEARNING

with all groups going out on the same day (Wednesdays) Look out for the timetable- it should be so much easier to organise Forest School kit!







- Wellies






As a school, we can offer a food bank voucher (subject to conditions). We can also offer small food parcels (subject to availability).
