

## School Rules



Remember we use positive reinforcement at St. Peter's Junior School.

### Helpers **WITHOUT** DBS check

Thank you for volunteering to help on this trip.

As you have not completed the DBS check, we are unable to allow you to be responsible for a group or to be left with children.

You are likely to be either with the whole class (e.g. walking to church) or as an additional adult in a group with a member of staff.

Try to encourage the children's behaviour to be exemplary by reminding them of our rules and pillars and giving them lots of praise. House points 'Have a house point!' are a great way to encourage.

Children should address you politely by your title and name e.g. Miss Jones or Mr. Smith? If there is poor behaviour, please simply remind them of the school rules. Anything further pass onto a member of staff.

### Helpers **WITH** DBS check

As a DBS school volunteer, you are able to manage a small group of children without a staff member. Try to encourage the children's behaviour to be exemplary by reminding them of our rules and pillars and giving them lots of praise. House points 'Have a housepoint' are a great way to encourage. If you have any concerns that you don't feel you can manage, get some help /advice from a staff member. Children should address you politely by your title and name e.g. Miss Jones or Mr. Smith? If there is poor behaviour, please simply remind them of the school rules. Anything further pass onto a member of staff.
