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What is a Family Empowerment Center?

A Family Empowerment Center serves parents and families of children and young adults with disabilities, between the ages of 3 and 22 in California.

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What do Family Empowerment Centers provide?

Family Empowerment Centers offer specialized training, peer-to-peer support, access to information, resources and support with referrals and services. FECs are staffed by parents, guardians, and family members of a person with a disability.

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How do Family Empowerment Center help families?

Family Empowerment Centers support parents to better understand their child's educational and developmental needs and serves as a resource to parents to navigate the IEP process.

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How and Why are Family Empowerment Centers Funded?

The California Department of Education funds WarmLine to ensure that parents, guardians, and families of children and young adults with disabilities have access to accurate information, specialized training, and peer-to-peer support.
