

## Letter Requesting Confirmation

Confirmation 2 candidates are expected to write a one-page letter explaining why they wish to be Confirmed. Please pay attention to grammar and punctuation. Unsatisfactory letters will be returned to the student to rewrite. Parents are encouraged to proof-read the letters. Letters must be typed, signed and either emailed in PDF format or printed and turned in by January 25, 2026.

Update: This year, our Confirmation ceremony will be celebrated by the Very Reverend Brian Flynn, Episcopal Vicar of the North Region.

When writing your letter, be sure to include:

- **The date**
- A Greeting: **“Dear Very Reverend Fr. Flynn,”**
- A description of who you are.
- How you are practicing your faith and all the things you have done to prepare for Confirmation.
- An explanation of why you wish to be confirmed.
- Include the Christian Service you have performed and what impact it has had on you.
- Your *handwritten signature* and your **name typed below.**
