GUIDELINES FOR WRITING ARTICLES ON EUROSCIENTIST

On EuroScientist we publish articles related to:

- Science policy
- Funding
- Science in society
- Science communication
- Scientists' career
- Responsible research and innovation
- Ethics
- Scientists' lifestyle

Structure of the articles:

- The article should be between 500 and 1,000 words
- if possible, as much as in a "journalistic" style, using subheadings, the active voice, transition words, short sentences, simple words and illustrations
- You can provide us with a main illustration (>600px-wide, landscape format that you have the right to use) otherwise we will look for a suitable one
- The abstract should be about 100 words
- a list of keywords should be provided
- at the end of the article, there can be one or several questions to call readers to comment on the article

Conditions and fee

- 2. The topic should be in line with EuroScientist's readers interests and fits within our eight main focuses: science policy, funding, science in society, scientists' careers, responsible science, ethics, innovation and scientists' lifestyle.
- 3. The article needs to be in line with EuroScience's ethics charter.
- 4. Every sponsored post will be charged €300 for publishing on our website and 500€ for publishing on the website and social media posts.
