Reading

Please listen to your child read as often as possible. Ten minutes practice an evening, alongside discussion and questions about the text, will help them clarify their understanding, gain reading stamina and build upon their comprehension skills. We will change books **twice a week** (Monday & Thursday) and the children will be read with regularly in school.

Spellings

A list of spellings will be sent home on a Friday for testing the following Friday. In Year 2, we will begin by revisiting the phase 2-5 tricky words from the Little Wandle Phonics scheme. Following that, we will be learning a set of 'Common Exception Words' and a list of spelling rules that the children will need to learn.

PE

PE will be on a **Monday** and on a **Thursday**. Please ensure that PE kit is in line with the school's expectations with earrings removed and long hair tied back.

This may change after half term but you will be informed via the school office if this is the case.
