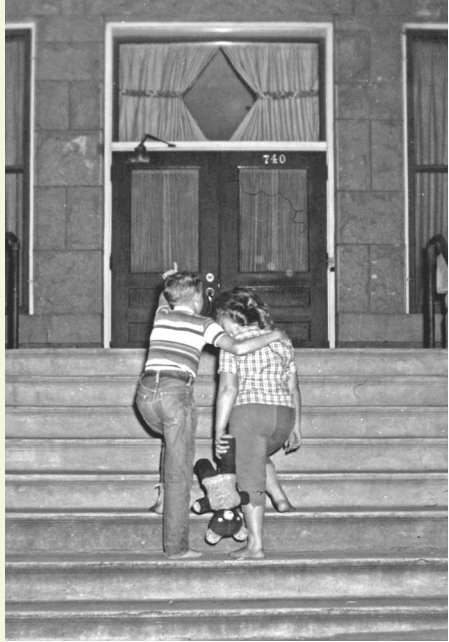

# The Heart of Our Mission

## Children's Home Counseling Center

Every day, children and families walk through our doors looking for hope and they find it through compassionate care and connection. At Children's Home Counseling Services, our dedicated clinicians provide emotional, behavioral, and mental health support for children, teens, and families through a variety of therapeutic approaches. During our 2024–2025 fiscal year, we **provided 18,884 sessions** that included individual and family counseling, peer groups, medication management, psychological evaluations, nature-based and animal-assisted therapy and school-based counseling.

Behind each session is a story of courage - a child learning to manage anxiety, a family rebuilding trust, or a teen discovering new ways to cope. Our counselors create safe, supportive spaces where healing begins through understanding, empathy, and connection. Together, we're helping families grow stronger and ensuring that every child knows they are never alone on their journey toward wellness.

## Nature-Based and Animal-Assisted Therapy

At Children's Home Counseling Services, we believe healing can happen anywhere connection and compassion are found, even in the company of animals and the quiet of open fields. Through our Nature-Based and Animal-Assisted Therapy program, clients experience the powerful bond between people, nature, and animals as part of their therapeutic journey. Our trained and certified clinicians currently provide sessions at **Warm Springs Care Farm** in Boise and **One by One Foundation**, located in Meridian, with plans underway to expand to additional farms across the Treasure Valley. These serene, hands-on environments offer children and families a unique space to grow, build trust, and find peace in nature. We are deeply grateful to our partners at Warm Springs Care Farm and the One by One Foundation for opening their hearts and their farms to make this healing work possible.

## Nature-Based and Animal-Assisted Training

Beyond serving our clients, this program also empowers the wider mental health community. Through specialized clinical training and certification, we're equipping professionals with the tools to integrate nature-based therapy into their own practices. Each participant earns continuing education (CE) hours, and upon completing the training, they have the opportunity to join our membership program, a growing network for clinicians across the Treasure Valley. This program fosters ongoing learning, collaboration, and support among mental health professionals dedicated to growth and community care. Thanks to a **generous \$300,000 grant from KeyBank**, we're expanding our reach and creating more opportunities for both therapists and clients to experience the transformative power of nature and connection.

## Training Center

At the Children's Home Training Center, we take pride in being a hub for professional growth and collaboration across the Treasure Valley. As an ACEP member and NBCC-certified organization, we provide continuing education opportunities for both our staff and mental health professionals throughout Idaho. In our previous fiscal year, **we delivered 1,179 total training hours**.

This year's sessions covered timely topics such as Ethics and Scope of Work, Healing From the Inside Out: Resiliency-Informed Somatic Therapy for Trauma Healing, and Suicide Prevention with a focus on LGBTQ+ youth. These trainings strengthen clinical skills, community partnerships, and resilience within the mental health field. Notably, **80% of our clinicians are EMDR-trained**, a highly effective therapy that helps individuals process and heal from trauma by reducing emotional distress and fostering lasting positive outcomes.

We also offer an Internship Program that helps address Idaho's mental health provider shortage. Many interns gain valuable hands-on experience and go on to join our team as full-time clinicians, continuing their commitment to care for children and families in our community.

## Supporting Students Where They Are

At Children's Home Counseling Services, we believe that every child deserves access to quality mental health care, no matter where they are. By providing counseling directly in schools and at the Boys & Girls Club of Ada County, we remove barriers such as transportation and scheduling challenges, ensuring students get the support they need during the school day.

In our 2024 - 2025 fiscal year, our **school-based counselors worked with 100 students** across multiple schools, providing **1,654 sessions** focused on emotional, behavioral, and social well-being. At the Boys & Girls Club, we reached an additional **14 students**, delivering **108 sessions** that helped youth build confidence, resilience, and connection.

These partnerships allow us to meet children where they feel most comfortable; at school and in their community—offering early intervention and a safe, consistent space to talk, learn, and grow. Together, we're helping students thrive both in and out of the classroom.

## Community Connections

Community is at the heart of everything we do. Through our outreach drives, partnerships, and new initiatives, we bring people together to support children and families in meaningful ways. This year, our Backpack Drive helped local students start the school year ready to learn, while our Winter Wear Giveaway kept families warm through the colder months. Thanks to the generosity of partners like **Pennecard Real Estate, Pacific Source, Pacific Crest, Boise East Rotary, Alpha Lambda Tau Sorority Inc.**, and countless donors and volunteers, these efforts remind families they are seen, valued, and supported. Together, they help extend our mission beyond counseling, creating a ripple of kindness and connection that strengthens our entire community.

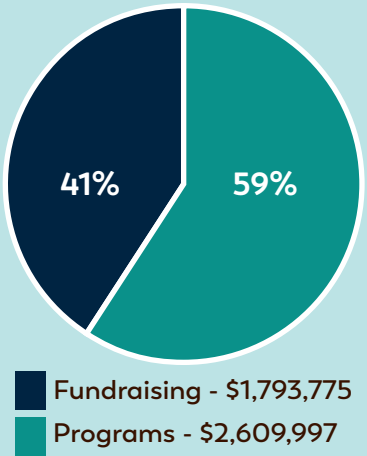
## The Mindful Mic Podcast

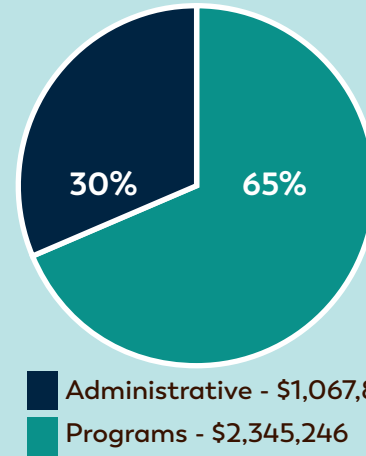

Revenue

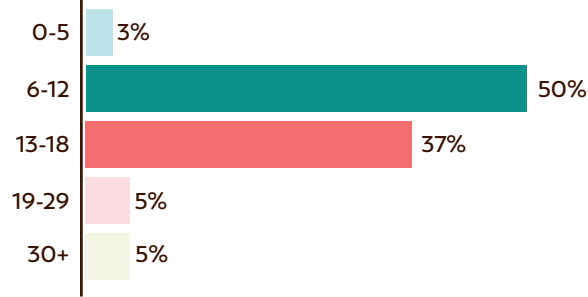


Expenses

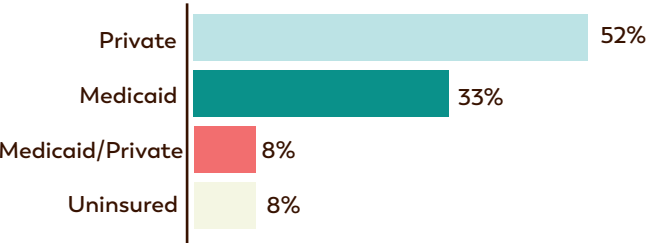

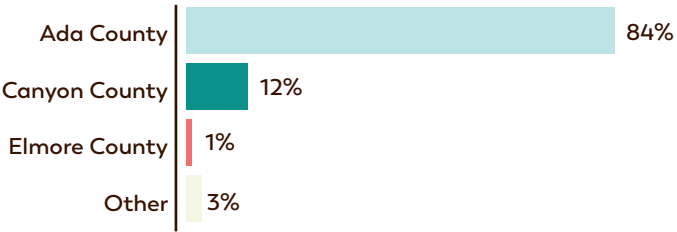
