#### **Sacrament of Baptism**

Baptisms are usually celebrated on a Sunday afternoon. Parents need to be registered parishioners and attend a Baptismal Preparation Class. At least one Godparent must be a practicing Catholic and obtain a Certificate of Eligibility from their parish.

# **Sponsor Eligibility**

Certificates of Eligibility for Baptism and Confirmation require the sponsor to be a registered and active member of the parish, and if married, in a valid marriage recognized by the Catholic Church. Please call the Parish Office for more information.

#### **Sacrament of Marriage**

Arrangements should be made at least six months prior to the proposed wedding date to begin pre-nuptial instructions before making any arrangements. Please call the parish office for more information and to schedule an appointment with the Pastor.

**TODAY'S LITURGY OF THE WORD:** In the first reading, the Apostles send a letter to Antioch explaining which practices [regarding the Mosaic law] are necessary for Gentiles who have come to believe in the Gospel. In the second reading, John describes his vision of the new Jerusalem, which shines with Christ's eternal light. Jesus, in the Gospel, foretells the coming of the Advocate. The Holy Spirit, Jesus tells his disciples, will teach you everything and remind you of all that I told you. Christians on pilgrimage to the Holy Land are often greeted with the words, "Welcome home." Indeed, the Church began in Jerusalem; Jesus died right outside of its walls; and it is also home to the first council recounted in today's first reading. Truly, our home is not in a particular place but in Christ, through the gift of the Holy Spirit. Jesus gives light to the new Jerusalem, which is the eternal city, the kingdom of God.
