Sacrament of Baptism

Baptisms are usually celebrated on a Sunday afternoon. Parents need to be registered parishioners and attend a Baptismal Preparation Class. At least one Godparent must be a practicing Catholic and obtain a Certificate of Eligibility from their parish.

Sponsor Eligibility

Certificates of Eligibility for Baptism and Confirmation require the sponsor to be a registered and active member of the parish, and if married, in a valid marriage recognized by the Catholic Church. Please call the Parish Office for more information.

Sacrament of Marriage

Arrangements should be made at least six months prior to the proposed wedding date to begin pre-nuptial instructions before making any arrangements. Please call the parish office for more information and to schedule an appointment with the Pastor.

TODAY’S LITURGY OF THE WORD: In the first reading, Melchizedek, king of Salem, brought out bread and wine and blessed Abram. Then Abram gave Melchizedek a tenth of everything. In the second reading, Paul tells the Corinthians that on the night Jesus was handed over, he took bread, gave thanks, broke it, and said, *This is my body that is for you. Do this in remembrance of me.* In the Gospel, the Twelve tell Jesus to dismiss the crowds so they can obtain food, but Jesus takes five loaves and two fish, blesses them, and feeds the crowd with them. On the feast of Corpus Christi, the second reading offers the earliest account of the institution of the Eucharist. Jesus tells his disciples that his body and blood are given for them and commands them to *do this in remembrance of me.* Jesus provides more than a meal; he gives us his very self, broken for us on the cross. Every time Mass is offered, Jesus’ sacrifice on the cross is re-presented and we are once again able to receive this gift of himself.

TODAY’S RESPONSORIAL PSALM: You are a priest forever, in the line of Melchizedek.
