Sacrament of Baptism

Baptisms are usually celebrated on a Sunday afternoon. Parents need to be registered parishioners and attend a Baptismal Preparation Class. At least one Godparent must be a practicing Catholic and obtain a Certificate of Eligibility from their parish.

Sponsor Eligibility

Certificates of Eligibility for Baptism and Confirmation require the sponsor to be a registered and active member of the parish, and if married, in a valid marriage recognized by the Catholic Church. Please call the Parish Office for more information.

Sacrament of Marriage

Arrangements should be made at least six months prior to the proposed wedding date to begin pre-nuptial instructions before making any arrangements. Please call the parish office for more information and to schedule an appointment with the Pastor.

TODAY'S LITURGY OF THE WORD: In the first reading, Peter is arrested, but prayer is made on his behalf and he is rescued by the angel of the Lord. In the second reading, Paul tells Timothy that he is being poured out like a libation and that he has finished the race. In the Gospel, Peter responds to Jesus' question about his identity by saying, You are the Christ, the Son of the living God. Jesus declares that he will give Peter the keys to the kingdom of heaven. The early Church offers us an example of intercessory prayer that we should imitate by praying fervently for the successor of Peter, the pope. You are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my Church.

TODAY'S RESPONSORIAL PSALM: The angel of the Lord will rescue those who fear him.
