Sacrament of Baptism

Baptisms are usually celebrated on a Sunday afternoon. Parents need to be registered parishioners and attend a Baptismal Preparation Class. At least one Godparent must be a practicing Catholic and obtain a Certificate of Eligibility from their parish.

Sponsor Eligibility

Certificates of Eligibility for Baptism and Confirmation require the sponsor to be a registered and active member of the parish, and if married, in a valid marriage recognized by the Catholic Church. Please call the Parish Office for more information.

Sacrament of Marriage

Arrangements should be made at least six months prior to the proposed wedding date to begin pre-nuptial instructions before making any arrangements. Please call the parish office for more information and to schedule an appointment with the Pastor.

TODAY’S LITURGY OF THE WORD: In the first reading, Moses urges his people to remember how the Lord guided and cared for them in the desert. In the second reading, Paul connects sharing in the cup of blessing with participating in Christ’s sacrifice and argues that the one bread that is broken bonds those who partake into one body. Jesus tells the crowds he is the living bread that came down from heaven and promises eternal life to all who eat his body and drink his blood. Today, on the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, we profess what we believe and celebrate at every Mass: The simple, ordinary gifts of bread and wine are transformed, by the power of the Holy Spirit, into our Lord’s Real Presence. When we partake of the Eucharist, Jesus remains with us. Let us pray that we may be more aware of this presence so we can proclaim this truth to others. In the Eucharist, the Lord nurtures our souls and makes us one with him.

TODAY’S RESPONSORIAL PSALM: Praise the Lord, Jerusalem.
