Sacrament of Baptism

Baptisms are usually celebrated on a Sunday afternoon. Parents need to be registered parishioners and attend a Baptismal Preparation Class. At least one Godparent must be a practicing Catholic and obtain a Certificate of Eligibility from their parish.

Sponsor Eligibility

Certificates of Eligibility for Baptism and Confirmation require the sponsor to be a registered and active member of the parish, and if married, in a valid marriage recognized by the Catholic Church. Please call the Parish Office for more information.

Sacrament of Marriage

Arrangements should be made at least six months prior to the proposed wedding date to begin pre-nuptial instructions before making any arrangements. Please call the parish office for more information and to schedule an appointment with the Pastor.

TODAY’S LITURGY OF THE WORD: In the first reading, Stephen witnesses Jesus in glory and prays for those who stone him. The witnesses lay down their cloaks at the feet of a young man named Saul. In the second reading, John describes hearing a voice speaking to him. It is Jesus sending his testimony that he is coming soon. In the Gospel, Jesus prays that all may be one, as he and the Father are one, so that all may know the Father through Jesus. Today, we recall with praise what Jesus has done for us by his suffering, death, and resurrection. We are called to not simply meditate on these events, but to bring the fruits of our prayer into the world as his witnesses. This is the task of the Church – to preach the Gospel to all nations – and we participate in this individually by living and proclaiming our faith within our own spheres of influence.

TODAY’S RESPONSORIAL PSALM: The Lord is king, the most high over all the earth.
