Sacrament of Baptism

Baptisms are usually celebrated on a Sunday afternoon. Parents need to be registered parishioners and attend a Baptismal Preparation Class. At least one Godparent must be a practicing Catholic and obtain a Certificate of Eligibility from their parish.

Sponsor Eligibility

Certificates of Eligibility for Baptism and Confirmation require the sponsor to be a registered and active member of the parish, and if married, in a valid marriage recognized by the Catholic Church. Please call the Parish Office for more information.

Sacrament of Marriage

Arrangements should be made at least six months prior to the proposed wedding date to begin pre-nuptial instructions before making any arrangements. Please call the parish office for more information and to schedule an appointment with the Pastor.

TODAY'S LITURGY OF THE WORD: In the first reading, the prophet Isaiah likens God's word to rain and snow, coming from God and achieving his purpose. In the epistle, Paul encourages the Romans to endure present suffering, anticipating God's glory and our redemption. In the Gospel from Matthew, Jesus tells the parable of the sower, explaining that the seed represents those who hear the Gospel. The images of the seed and God's word run through the readings today. God is both sower and seed. He provides water and light and brings growth. As we contemplate this image of a seed bursting into life, let us pause and ask the Holy Spirit to help us be open to how God is working in us, providing us the grace we need to bear abundant fruit for him.

TODAY'S RESPONSORIAL PSALM: The seed that falls on good ground will yield a fruitful harvest.
