Sacrament of Baptism

Baptisms are usually celebrated on a Sunday afternoon. Parents need to be registered parishioners and attend a Baptismal Preparation Class. At least one Godparent must be a practicing Catholic and obtain a Certificate of Eligibility from their parish.

Sponsor Eligibility

Certificates of Eligibility for Baptism and Confirmation require the sponsor to be a registered and active member of the parish, and if married, in a valid marriage recognized by the Catholic Church. Please call the Parish Office for more information.

Sacrament of Marriage

Arrangements should be made at least six months prior to the proposed wedding date to begin pre-nuptial instructions before making any arrangements. Please call the parish office for more information and to schedule an appointment with the Pastor.

TODAY'S LITURGY OF THE WORD: In the first reading, Moses encourages the people to observe the law of the Lord, telling them it is not too mysterious and remote for them. He assures them that the law is already in their mouths and hearts. In the second reading, Paul proclaims Christ as the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation. In response to a question from a scholar of the law on how to inherit eternal life, Jesus tells a parable about a man who fell victim to robbers and the only person who helped him was a Samaritan. Our Gospel challenges us with the question: Who is my neighbor? It is a question with profound implications for how we relate to and treat others in our world. As we hear the parable of the Good Samaritan, we are challenged by Christ to treat all with respect and love, especially the poor, the dispossessed, and the most vulnerable.

TODAY'S RESPONSORIAL PSALM: Turn to the Lord in your need, and you will live.
