Sacrament of Baptism

Baptisms are usually celebrated on a Sunday afternoon. Parents need to be registered parishioners and attend a Baptismal Preparation Class. At least one Godparent must be a practicing Catholic and obtain a Certificate of Eligibility from their parish.

Sponsor Eligibility

Certificates of Eligibility for Baptism and Confirmation require the sponsor to be a registered and active member of the parish, and if married, in a valid marriage recognized by the Catholic Church. Please call the Parish Office for more information.

Sacrament of Marriage

Arrangements should be made at least six months prior to the proposed wedding date to begin pre-nuptial instructions before making any arrangements. Please call the parish office for more information and to schedule an appointment with the Pastor.

TODAY'S LITURGY OF THE WORD: In the first reading, we hear that a shoot shall sprout from the stump of Jesse and from this line a Savior will bring peace and salvation. In the Gospel, John the Baptist calls people to repent and tells of one who is coming who will baptize with the Holy Spirit and fire. Let us prepare the way of the Lord by asking for God's healing, listening for God's voice, and raising our hearts to him.

2026 MASS INTENTION BOOK AT ST. RICHARD

OFFICIALLY OPENS Wednesday, December 10th at 10:00AM. **No requests** will be accepted prior to the above date. Requests will be accepted through the Revised Mass Intention Form (found in church or online) and may be mailed, placed in the collection, or dropped at the office. The forms must be fully completed with the enclosed \$10 per Mass stipend/Candle fee. As there is an overflow of Masses and Mass times are limited; we cannot guarantee a specific date and time for Mass intentions. To try and accommodate the intentions (*which also includes reserved dates*), there is a limit of three Masses. Please also consider having a weekday Mass, remembering your loved one through the Eternal Remembrance Society (contact the Parish Office), the Sanctuary Lamp or one of the Devotional Candles.
