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


But what is the appropriate design for your company? What message do you want to send to both your employees and potential customers?

- Lighting: creating the right lighting is imperative when designing. Copper lampshades and rounded bulbs can make for great features throughout your office.






Minimalist Design:

- Storage: Minimalism is based on the concept of little, to no clutter. Finding the right storage solution for your business is important when creating the right minimalistic design.


 Furniture: As with the storage, it is important to find furniture and other features that are both streamlined, simplistic and good quality.

- Plants: Mounted living walls can make a fantastic addition to those wishing implement biophillic design to their offices.






Classic


