



Spring Power Line Safety

Spring has finally arrived, and with that yard and field work will soon begin. As getting into the field has been delayed with the weather, we want to remind members not to rush and to be vigilant by looking up and being aware of where the power poles and lines are located.

- Seeding is around the corner and while large equipment benefits productivity, it can also increase the chances of coming into contact with power poles and lines. Please ensure that you use caution when moving equipment within your yard or from site to site.
- As you are completing yard improvements, remember to leave clearance for power lines. In order to properly maintain our lines (and prevent outages & bumping), we require that trees be planted at least 7 meters away from poles.
- Exercise caution when trimming & pruning trees near the power line. Our linemen are diligent when it comes to noting trees of concern. If you have any inquiries regarding brushing on site, please contact the office.

Our linemen are available to measure power lines for you to ensure your safety during this busy season!
