- 3 though its waters roar and foam, though the mountains tremble at its swelling. Selah
- 4 There is a river whose streams make glad the city of God, the holy habitation of the Most High.
- 5 God is in the midst of her; she shall not be moved; God will help her when morning dawns.

Habakkuk 3:17-18 ESV

- 16 holding fast to the word of life, so that in the day of Christ I may be proud that I did not run in vain or labor in vain.
- 17 Even if I am to be poured out as a drink offering upon the sacrificial offering of your faith, I am glad and rejoice with you all.
- 18 Likewise you also should be glad and rejoice with me.

Acts 16:20-26 ESV

- 20 And when they had brought them to the magistrates, they said, "These men are Jews, and they are disturbing our city.
- 21 They advocate customs that are not lawful for us as Romans to accept or practice."
- 22 The crowd joined in attacking them, and the magistrates tore the garments off them and gave orders to beat them with rods.
- 23 And when they had inflicted many blows upon them, they threw them into prison, ordering the jailer to keep them safely.
- 24 Having received this order, he put them into the inner prison and fastened their feet in the stocks.
- 25 About midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God, and the prisoners were listening to them,
- 26 and <u>suddenly there was a great earthquake</u>, so that <u>the foundations</u> of the prison <u>were shaken</u>. And <u>immediately all the doors</u> were <u>opened</u>, and <u>everyone's bonds</u> were <u>unfastened</u>.

Acts 7:54-60 ESV

- 54 Now when they heard these things they were enraged, and they ground their teeth at him.
- 55 But he, <u>full of the Holy Spirit</u>, <u>gazed into heaven</u> and <u>saw the glory of God</u>, and <u>Jesus standing at the right hand of God</u>.
- 56 And he said, "Behold, I see the heavens opened, and the Son of Man standing at the right hand of God."
- 57 But they cried out with a loud voice and stopped their ears and rushed together at him.
- 58 Then they cast him out of the city and stoned him. And the witnesses laid down their garments at the feet of a young man named Saul.
- 59 And as they were stoning Stephen, he called out, "Lord Jesus, receive my spirit."
- 60 And falling to his knees he cried out with a loud voice, "Lord, <u>do not hold this sin against them</u>." And when he had said this, <u>he fell asleep.</u>

James 1:2-4 ESV

- 2 Count it all joy, my brothers, when you meet trials of various kinds,
- 3 for you know that the testing of your faith produces steadfastness.
- 4 And let steadfastness have its full effect, that you may be perfect and complete, lacking in nothing.
