Abiding in Jesus Pt.2

April 19, 2020

John 15:1-11 ESV

1 I am the true vine, and my Father is the vinedresser.

John 4:13-14 ESV

13 Jesus said to her, "Everyone who drinks of this water will be thirsty again,

14 but whoever drinks of the water that I will give him will never be thirsty again. The <u>water that I will</u> <u>give</u> him will <u>become in him</u> a <u>spring of water welling up to eternal life</u>."

- No matter how good-tasting, refreshing, reviving or vital to life water is, it cannot touch what the spirit and soul needs.
- When the spirit and soul are empty and dead, the natural life is not worth living.

Isaiah 5:1-5 ESV

1 Let me sing for my beloved my love song concerning his vineyard: My beloved had a vineyard on a very fertile hill.

2 <u>He dug it</u> and <u>cleared it of stones</u>, and <u>planted it with choice vines</u>; he <u>built a watchtower</u> in the midst of it, and hewed out a wine vat in it; and he looked for it to yield grapes, but it yielded wild grapes.

3 And now, O inhabitants of Jerusalem and men of Judah, judge between me and my vineyard.

- 4 <u>What more was there to do</u> for my vineyard, that I have not done in it? When I looked for it to yield grapes, why did it yield wild grapes?
- 5 <u>Why will you still be struck down?</u> Why will you continue to rebel? The whole head is sick, and the whole heart faint.
 - God gives His garden all of Himself, the very best care, and yet the rebellion in man's heart refuses to glorify, thank, worship, love or serve Him.
 - Because of the rebellious pride in human nature, God must administer the pain of chastisement.

Hebrews 12:5-6 ESV

5 And have you forgotten the exhortation that addresses you as sons? "My son, <u>do not regard lightly</u> the <u>discipline</u> of the Lord, <u>nor be weary</u> when <u>reproved</u> by him.

6 For the Lord disciplines the one he loves, and chastises every son whom he receives."

John 15:1-11 ESV

2 <u>Every branch in me</u> that <u>does not bear fruit</u> he <u>takes away</u>, and <u>every branch that does bear fruit</u> he <u>prunes</u>, that it <u>may bear more fruit</u>.

Hebrews 6:4-6 ESV

4 For <u>it is impossible</u>, in <u>the case of those</u> who <u>have once been enlightened</u>, who have tasted the heavenly gift, and have shared in the Holy Spirit,

5 and have tasted the goodness of the word of God and the powers of the age to come,

6 and then have fallen away, to restore them again to repentance, since they are crucifying once again the Son of God to their own harm and holding him up to contempt.

- "...since they again <u>crucify to themselves</u> the Son of God..." NASB
- These have lost their salvation, not because of their sinful actions, but because they've lost the ability to repent.
- Losing the ability to repent is what you need to fear first and foremost.
- Those who are repentant are eternally secure, but what if you have lost the ability to repent?
- There is a hardening of the heart and a searing of the conscience which renders a person incapable of repentance.

1 Timothy 4:1-2 ESV

1 Now the Spirit expressly says that in later times some will depart from the faith by devoting themselves to deceitful spirits and teachings of demons,

2 through the insincerity of liars whose consciences are seared,

Hebrews 5:11-14 ESV

11 About this <u>we have much to say</u>, and it is <u>hard to explain</u>, since <u>you have become dull of hearing</u>.

12 For though by this time you ought to be teachers, you need someone to teach you again the basic principles of the oracles of God. <u>You need milk</u>, <u>not solid food</u>,

13 for everyone who <u>lives on milk</u> is <u>unskilled in the word of righteousness</u>, since <u>he is a child</u>.

14 But <u>solid food is for the mature</u>, for those who <u>have their powers of discernment trained</u> by <u>constant practice</u> to <u>distinguish good from evil</u>.

• Every circumstance and situation of our lives are ordered by God with a specific, eternal purpose of cutting away and cleansing the sin.

2 Corinthians 12:7-10 ESV

7 So to <u>keep me from becoming conceited</u> because of the surpassing greatness of the revelations, <u>a thorn</u> was given me in the flesh, a <u>messenger of Satan to harass me</u>, to <u>keep me from becoming conceited</u>.

8 Three times I pleaded with the Lord about this, that it should leave me.

9 But he said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness." Therefore <u>I will boast all the more gladly of my weaknesses</u>, so <u>that the power of Christ may rest upon me</u>.

10 <u>For the sake of Christ</u>, then, <u>I am content with</u> <u>weaknesses</u>, <u>insults</u>, <u>hardships</u>, <u>persecutions</u>, and <u>calamities</u>. For <u>when I am weak</u>, <u>then I am strong</u>.

1 Peter 4:1-2 ESV

1 Since therefore Christ suffered in the flesh, <u>arm yourselves with the same way of thinking</u>, for <u>whoever</u> <u>has suffered in the flesh</u> has <u>ceased from sin</u>,

2 so as to live for the rest of the time in the flesh no longer for human passions but for the will of God.

John 15:1-11 ESV

3 Already you are clean because of the word that I have spoken to you.

Hebrews 4:12 ESV

12 For the word of God is living and active, sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing to the division of soul and of spirit, of joints and of marrow, and discerning the thoughts and intentions of the heart.

Isaiah 55:10-11 ESV

10 For as the rain and the snow come down from heaven and do not return there but water the earth, making it bring forth and sprout, giving seed to the sower and bread to the eater,

11 so shall my word be that goes out from my mouth; it shall not return to me empty, but it shall accomplish that which I purpose, and shall succeed in the thing for which I sent it.

John 17:17 ESV

17 <u>Sanctify</u> [set them apart for holy service to God] <u>them</u> in the <u>truth; your word is truth</u>.

James 1:21 ESV

21 Therefore put away all filthiness and rampant wickedness and <u>receive with meekness</u> the <u>implanted</u> <u>word</u>, which is <u>able to save your souls</u>.

- The Word of God gives birth within you all the will and ability you need to obey.
- The Word of God <u>first</u> births within you the desire to will, and <u>second</u>, the ability to obey.
- Jesus is not saying the disciples were altogether clean and holy, free of any carnality and sin. He was saying that the cleansing of the heart had already begun by the Word He had spoken.
- Jesus was saying that as long as your heart is open and surrendered to the Word of God, cleansing is continually ongoing.

John 15:1-11 ESV

4 <u>Abide in me</u>, and <u>I in you</u>. As the branch cannot bear fruit by itself, unless it abides in the vine, neither can you, unless you abide in me.

- Abiding in Christ
 - o continuity of relationship and fellowship throughout the day and the years
 - holy obsession of delighting in and resting in Him
 - o meditation on God's Word
 - prayer without ceasing
 - o praise, worship, thanksgiving
 - 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18 ESV
 - 16 Rejoice always,
 - 17 pray without ceasing,
 - 18 give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you.

Psalm 1:2-3 ESV

2 but his delight is in the law of the LORD, and <u>on his law</u> he <u>meditates day and night</u>.
3 He is like a <u>tree planted by streams of water</u> that <u>yields its fruit in its season</u>, and <u>its leaf does not wither</u>. In <u>all that he does</u>, <u>he prospers</u>.

John 15:1-11 ESV

5 I am the vine; you are the branches. Whoever abides in me and I in him, he it is that bears much fruit, for apart from me you can do nothing.

Galatians 5:16-23 ESV

16 But I say, walk by the Spirit, and you will not gratify the desires of the flesh.

17 For the desires of the flesh are against the Spirit, and the desires of the Spirit are against the flesh, for these are opposed to each other, to keep you from doing the things you want to do.

18 But if you are led by the Spirit, you are not under the law.

19 Now the works of the flesh are evident: sexual immorality, impurity, sensuality,

20 idolatry, sorcery, enmity, strife, jealousy, fits of anger, rivalries, dissensions, divisions,

21 envy, drunkenness, orgies, and things like these. I warn you, as I warned you before, that those who do such things will not inherit the kingdom of God.

22 But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness,

23 gentleness, self-control; against such things there is no law.

- Spiritual maturity is not measured by natural accomplishments. Spiritual maturity is measured by the character of the heart. It's not what I have achieved but Who I know and who I have become.
- The fruit that Jesus looks for is impossible for us to produce. It is only produced by His life active in us. Therefore the Christian life is not one of straining and striving but surrender and abiding.
- The fall from grace into sin when we stop abiding is instantaneous. Our only resistance to and deliverance from sin is the power of God.

John 15:1-11 ESV

6 If <u>anyone does not abide in me</u> he is <u>thrown away like a branch</u> and <u>withers</u>; and <u>the branches are gathered</u>, <u>thrown into the fire</u>, and <u>burned</u>.

- Can there be any mistake in this interpretation? Jesus is not speaking in riddles or mysteries.
- Abiding in Christ is not a feature, not a "nice-to-have" luxury. Your eternity hinges on abiding in Christ.
